*Petersbourg, January 27.*

**G**eneral Lowendahl is arrived here from his Government at Revel: He was sent for now, as he was last Summer, to regulate several Things belonging to the Train of Artillery. As his Lady is to follow him, it is thought that he will make some Stay here, and a Notion prevails, that he may probably be placed in the Council of War. The Saxon Colonel Neubour set out last Night on his Return to Dresden. General Uxkall, a Livonian Gentleman of a good Family and Estate, who is in this Service, has been lately put under Arrest, and it is said that a Council of War will be appointed to sit upon him. An Order was Yesterday published, that all Officers and Soldiers absent on Furloes should return to their Posts by the latter End of March; and at the same Time Orders were issued for raising forthwith 30000 Recruits. Mr. Finch, Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Great Britain, had on Sunday last an Audience of her Highness the Grand Dutchess; in which he complimented her, in the King his Master's Name, on her Regency. And M. Backhoff, the Danish Envoy, had also an Audience of her Highness the same Day, to compliment her in the King his Master's Name, upon the same Occasion.

*Naples, Jan. 31, N. S.* The 20th Instant being the Anniversary of the King's Birth-day, the same was celebrated here with great Solemnity; on which Occasion the Foreign Ministers and Nobility went in rich Habits to compliment their Majesties; and in the Evening there was a triple Discharge of the Artillery at the Castles. On the 27th anchored at this Port his Britannick Majesty's Ship the Dragon, Capt. Barnett Commander, convoying some Merchantmen for this Place and Messina.

*Leghorne, Feb. 10.* On the 9th sailed from this Port his Britannick Majesty's Ship

the Kennington, Capt. Peyton Commander, with 16 Merchantmen under his Convoy for England.

*Hambourg, Feb. 21, N. S.* The Duke Administrator of Holstein set out from this Place Yesterday Morning, and is returned to his usual Residence at Eutin.

*Antwerp, Feb. 22, N. S.* The Differences which have of late subsisted between the Government of Brussels and that of Liege, were adjusted some Days since by a Provisional Agreement, which restores the free Intercourse of Commerce between the said Countries, and leaves Things upon the same Foot they were when the Archdutchess assured the Government of the Low Countries, till such Time as they shall be farther and more finally settled in the Conferences which are appointed to be held for that Purpose within the Space of three Months.
