Berlin, March 11, N. S.

YESTERDAY arrived here an Officer, preceded by five Postillions, with the News of the taking of Glogow. The Particulars he brought in general are said to be, that Prince Leopold of Anhalt, who commands the Troops before that Town; took it by Surprize, having caused a general Attack to be made at one and the same Time at all the Gates of the Town, at Twelve a-Clock at Night: That the said Gates having been broke down by the Grenadiers with their Axes, the Prussians got into the Town before the whole Garrison could be under Arms, and which in all made only between 7 and 800 Men. In this Action very few Men were killed; on the Side of the Prussians, they say only 50 killed or wounded. Amongst the Austrians Major General Rasky was dangerously wounded.

Whitehall, March 10.

This Day arrived Letters from Sir Chaloner Ogle, dated at St. Christopher's December 28, with an Account, that he arrived there with the Squadron under his Command on the 27th, where he found his Majesty's Ship the Montagu, and the Princess Royal Hospital-Ship, and all the Transports and Store-Ships that had been separated from him. Sir

Chaloner intended to sail from St. Christopher's for Jamaica on the same Day that his Letters were dated.
