HE Court has ordered the Council of Commerce to fignify to the Merchants, that they may load Goods for Constantinople on board the two Ships of War St. Phillip and Parthenope, which are on their Departure to carry the King's Ambassadur to the Porte. On the 23d Instant, by Order of the Court, Notice was given to Prince Taxis, that he should leave this City and Kingdom within eight Days.

Eeghorn, March To. On the 4th Inflant failed from hence, for Port Mahon, his Britannick Majesty's Ship the Dragon, with several British Merchant Ships under her Convoy. She is to call in her Way at Genoa, to take with her such Merchant Ships as shall be ready. From Port Mahon those Ships will proceed under another Convoy for England. The said Ship of War, as well as the Merchant-men, have taken in at this Port a large Quantity of Biscuit for Admiral Haddock's Squadron.

Stockholm, March 12. Count Sparre, one of the Senators of this Kingdom, and late his Majesty's Minister to the Court of Great Britain, has been a long Time indisposed, and is now thought to be past all Hopes of Recovery. Four of the Galleys in this Port are getting ready to put to Sea with all Expedition.

Copenhagen, April 1, N. S. On the 25th past died the Grand Veneur, M. Gram, who was likewise Privy Councellor, Knight of the Order of the Elephant, and Bailist of Fridericksbourg and Cronenbourg. The Post of Grand Veneur is the most Lucrative in this Country; and as the Grand Marshal, eldest Son to the deceased, is likely to succeed

to the aforesaid Baillages, and of Course must leave the Court, this Accident is like to occasion two very considerable Vacancies. All the Frigates are actually in such a Readiness, that they may put to Sea in Eight or Ten Days Time; and they have now begun to work upon the Men of War. Yesterday the Prince Royal of Denmark entred into the 19th Year of his Age, but as it happened to be Good-Friday, his Birth-Day was not celebrated.

Hague, April 7. N. S. On Wednesday last the Affair of the second Augmentation of 10000. Men was resumed and finally conscluded by the States General. Letters from Vienna of the 7th of March last advise, that the Turks had not only acknowledged the Queen of Hungary, but that all Points in Dispute between them and the Court of Vienna had been compromised and finished, by this latter's coming into all the Demands of the Porte, with respect to the Limits on the Side of Bosnia; as the Porte is said to have done into those of the Court of Vienna, with respect to those on the Side of the Danube. Count Golowkin has received by the last Post, Orders to animate this State to declare for the Support of its Engagements in Favour of the Queen of Hungary.
