St. James's, June 11.

HIS Day being the Anniverlary of his Majesty's Succession to the Crown, there was a fplendid Appearance at Court of the Lords Juitices, Nobi-

lity, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Diffinction, to compliment his Royal High-nels the Duke, and their Royal Highneffes the Princefles, on that happy Occasion. The Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired, and all publick Demonstrations of Joy were made.

Hanover, June 8. On Thursday last in the Afternoon his Highness Prince William of Heffe arrived here; and immediately proceeded to wait on his Majefty at Herrenhaufen. The next Day in the Evening Major General Legonier arrived here from England, and waited on his Majesty at Herrenhausen.

From on board His Majesty's Ship the Ru-pert, in Plymouth Sound, June 9, 1741. On the 17th paft we took our Station for cruizing off St. Sebastian. On the 31st at Eleven in the Morning we faw a Sail which came out of the Harbour of St. Sebaftian, we imme-diately gave her Chace, and at Four in the Afternoon came up with her and took her : She proved to be a Privateer called the Bifcaia belonging to St. Sebastian, mounting ten Carriage and two Swivel Guns, had on board 150 Piftols, 19 Blunderbuffes, 140 Muskets, 166 Cutlaffes, 20 Pikes, and a great Number of Powder-Flasks, Hand-Granades and Pole-Axes; fhe had but 119 Men on board, tho' by the Roll of the Skip's Company the fhould have had 140, so that it is prefumed the rest were killed in the Action and thrown overboard : This Privateer came out of St. Se-Bastian at Five that Morning. The Engage-ment was very finart on both Sides, we having been obliged to fire 31 Chace Guns with Round and Partridge Shot, and a great Number of Small-Arms at her before fhe ftruck : Nay, after the Captain, who was a Frenchman, had ftruck his Colours, the two Lieutenants, who were Dutchnien, hoifted them and continued the Fight till we obliged them to strike. The above Privateer has taken 23 Prizes fince the Be-ginning of the War. The 119 Men we took

are a Sett of rugged, able-bodied, desperate Fellows. This is the Vessel that took the Ship coming from Carolina, where Colonel Brathwait was fhot in cold Blood after the Action was over; and, if the Spaniards who are Prifoners on board inform us right, we have the French Officer that flot him a Prifoner now on board.
