N the 10th sailed his Britannick Majesty's Ship the Dursly, Captain Hughes Commander, for Genoa and the Streights.

Turin, July 5, N.S. The Joy occasion'd by the Birth of the Duke of Chablais has proved but of short Duration, and has given Place to a general Consternation and Grief, on account of the Queen of Sardinia's Death, which happened at the Venerie on Monday Morning the 3d Instant, after eleven Days Ill-ness of a malignant Fever. The king of Sardinia, with the Duke of Savoy, immediately retired to a Chartreuse about three Miles from hence, and the young Princes and Princesses were all brought to this Place. The Funeral will be performed in the Cathedral Church of this City To-morrow Night. His Sardinian Majesty is under great Concern, and the Court is ordered to go into the closest Mourning.

Hanover, July 11. Her Royal Highness the Princess of Hesse, her Consort Frederick Prince of Hesse, and Princess Mary his Sister, arrived at Herrenhausen on Thursday last about Ten at Night; as did her Royal Highness the Princess of Orange on Saturday last in the Evening. The two Deputies who were kere last Year from the City of Lubeck, arrived on Sunday last to compliment his Majesty, on the Part of that City, upon his safe Arrival in these his Dominions. The same Asternoon Mr. Anstis, Garter Principal King at Arms, arrived here from England, to invest the Prince of Hesse with the Ensigns of the most Noble Order of the Garter; which Ceremony its said will be performed this Afternoon.
