Their Excellencies the Lords Juffices in Council were this Day pleased to order, that the Parliament which flands prorogued to Thursday the Sixth of this Instant August, should be further prorogued to Thursday the Tenth Day of September next. And that the Convocations of Canterbury and York, which fland prorogued to Friday the Seventh of this Instant August, should be further pro-rogued to Friday the Eleventh Day of September next.

Naples, July 11, N. S. On the 3d Inftant the Duke di Caftropignano, with his Lady and Family, arrived here from Pifa, and immediately went to Court, to pay his Duty to the King on his Return from his Ambaffy at the French Court ; and on the 5th he took the Oath of Allegiance to his Majefty for the Office of Captain General of his Forces ; On the 6th M. de Sangro, Lieutenant General, who in his Absence has acted in his stead, repaired to his Government of Capua.

Rome, July 15, N.S. M. Tun, the Queen of Hungary's Minister, as well as the Abbot Franchini, and Count Spada Resident of the Great Duke of Tuscany, have frequent Au-diences of the Pope, to follicit for her Ma-jefty's Use, a Tax of Ten per Cent. on the Ecclesiaftical Revenues in her Dominions, in Confideration of the prefent Expences of the War. The Pope has appointed a Con-gregation, with Intention 'tis thought to grant the Request.

Leghorne, July 21, N.S. This Place has been in some Apprehension, on Account of a Rumour (pread, that a peftilential Sickness had been difcovered on board a French Vef-fel from Algiers performing Quarantine in this Road, four Perfons having died in her: In Confequence of which the Magistrates of Health have ordered the most strict Precautions to be observed, and placed strong Guards to prevent the Ship's Crew coming on Shore, or having Communication with any of our Inhabitants. By the Arrival of a Vessel under the Pope's Colours in five Days from Toulon, we learn, that they were fitting out

at that Port 14 Ships of War. Florence, July 23. N.S. Leghorne. Petersbourg, July 11. Advice was recei-ved here this Week from Stockholm, that a Refolution had been taken by the Dyet, to transport to Finland a Body of 4000 Horse, and that Orders were given to repair with all Expedition the Bridge at North Tellie, where they are to be embarked. That an Embargo was laid on the Shipping for this Purpose, and a Contract made with the Merchant Kerman to furnish the Horse with necellary Forage for their Voyage. Gene-ral Keith will, it is faid, go To-mor-row to Wybourg, to review the Troops encamped on that Side, amounting to about 18000 Foot, and 4000 Dragoons, and to take upon him the Command of that Body, which in Cafe of Necellity may be foon which, in Cafe of Necessity, may be soon reinforced by Detachments from another Camp on the Narva Side, of about the lame Number, under the Command of the Prince of Hefle Hombourg. These Troops are so canton'd and encamp'd, that a Body of Fisty to Sixty Thousand Men, may in a very sew Days be drawn together.
