*Hanover, September 8, N. S.*

**O**N the 4th Instant in the Evening arrived here M. de Buffy, his most Christian Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary to the King of Great Britain; he was the next Morning in Conference with the Lord Harrington, and went afterwards to Herrenhausen, where he had a private Audience of his Majesty. On the 6th, by Eight in the Morning, his Majesty came from Herrenhausen to this City in an open Chaise, to see the two Battallions of Foot Guards, and Bothmar's Regiment of Foot, march off for the intended Camp near Hamel; they passed by his Majesty in such regular Order, and made so fine an Appearance as gave his Majesty entire Satisfaction. In the Evening about 600 Militia came into the Town under Arms, and were immediately posted in the proper Places, being to garrison it during the Absence of his Majesty's Guards upon other Service. Tomorrow the King will set out from Herrenhausen for Lintzburg, where his Majesty intends to pass some Time, in order to be the nearer at Hand to review his Camps which are forming near the Weser. His Majesty has been pleased to appoint William Burroughs, Esq; to be Commissary-General of Stores, Provisions and Forage, to the Danish and Hessian Troops in the Pay of Great Britain.

*Spithead, Sept. 1.* His Majesty's Ship the Torrington, with two Merchantmen under her Convoy, is arrived here from Jamaica.

*Dover, Sept. 1.* His Majesty's Sloop the Swift has taken and brought into this Harbour a Vessel belonging to St. Sebastian's, (to which Port she was bound when taken) having on board 26 Six Pounders, 20 other small Guns, with Powder, Shot, &c.

*Dover, Sept. 2.* This Day his Majesty's Ship the Windsor arrived here in her Way to Woolwich; which Ship, on the 20th of Ju-

ly, in her Voyage from Jamaica to England, chased and came up with a Vessel called the Sarah, of 120 Tons, belonging to Boston in New-England, Isaac Dupee, Master, laden with Rum, Boards, &c. who had been taken by a Spanish Privateer Sloop called the St. Antonio, Don Pedro Astra, Master, of eight Carriage and ten Swivel Guns, and 120 Men; she had ten Spaniards on board, who were carrying her and three English Prisoners to St. Augustine's; which Ship the Windsor re-took, and putting proper Hands on board, ordered her to make the best of her Way to England.
