Hanover, September 8, N.S.

N the 4th Inftant in the Evening arrived here M. de Buffy, his most Christian Majesty's Ambaslador Extraordinary to the King of Great Britain; he was the next Morning in Con-ference with the Lord Harrington, and went afterwards to Herrenhausen, where he had a private Audience of his Majesty. On the 6th, by Eight in the Morning, his Majesty came from Herrenhausen to this City in an open Chaife, to fee the two Battallions of Foot Guards, and Bothmar's Regiment of Foot, march off for the intended Camp near Hamel; they passed by his Majesty in fuch regular Order, and made to fine an Appearance as gave his Majefty entire Satisfaction. In the Evening about 600 Militia came into the Town under Arms, and were im-mediately posted in the proper Places, be-ing to garrifon it during the Absence of his Majestry's Guards upon other Service. Tomorrow the King will fet out from Herrenhausen for Lintzburg, where his Majesty in-tends to pass fome Time, in order to be the nearer at Hand to review his Camps which are forming near the Wefer. His Majefty has been pleafed to appoint William Bur-roughs, Efq; to be Commilfary-General of Stores Provisions and Earson to the Day of Stores, Provisions and Forage, to the Danish and Heffian Troops in the Pay of Great Britaih.

Spithead, Sept. 1. His Majesty's Ship the Torrington, with two Merchantmen under her Convoy, is arrived here from Jamaica.

Dover, Sept. 1. His Majesty's Sloop the Swift has taken and brought into this Har-bour a Veffel belonging to St. Sebastian's, (to which Port she was bound when taken) having on board 26 Six Pounders, 20 other fmall Guns, with Powder, Shot, &c.

Dover, Sept. 2. This Day his Majesty's Ship the Windfor arrived here in her Way to Woolwich; which Ship, on the 20th of Ju-

ly, in her Voyage from Jamaica to England, chafed and came up with a Veffel called the Sarah, of 120 Tons, belonging to Bofton in New-England, Isaac Dupee, Master, laden with Rum, Boards, &c. who had been taken by a Spanish Privateer Sloop called the St. Antonio, Don Pedro Astra, Master, of eight Carriage and ten Swivel Guns, and 120 Men; fhe had ten Spaniards on board, who were carrying her and three English Prifoners to St. Augustine's ; which Ship the Windfor re-took, and putting proper Hands on board, ordered her to make the beft of her Way to England.
