N the 6th Inftant the Anniverfary of the young Princess, who then entred into the Second Year of her Age, was celebrated at Court with great Solemnity; on which Occasion the Ministers, Nobility, and Military Officers ap-peared in rich Habits. The Present which the Turkish Amballador brought from the Grand Signior to his Sicilian Majesty, and prefented Yesterday at his publick Audience, is faid to confift of, a Tent of Crimfon Vel-vet embroidered with Gold and Pearls, with its Taffels also with Pearls; a Cutlass worked in the fame Manner with a String and Taflel of Pearls; fix Horfes with their Furniture embroidered with Jewels; fix Pair of Pittols and two Muskets richly fet with Gold and Jewels; Twenty one Pieces of Perfian Bro-cades with Gold Flowers; three Bales of Carpets; a Quantity of Mecca Balfam; two Elephants, and four Camels; thirty Christian Slaves; a Breast Jewel for the Queen, and a Box which the Queen is defired to open herself, which makes it believed there is fomething very precious in it. M. Borras, Commodore of the Ships of War St. Rhillip and Parthenope, was this Day, by the King's Order, removed from his Poft, for not having faluted, when at Constantinople, four French Men of War then at Anchor near the Walls of the Seraglio. The King has appointed in his Room the Knight of Malta Majo, who has already received Orders to prepare the Ship Parthenope, of which he is Commander, to conduct back to Constantinople the Turkish Ambassador; fo that it is imagined that Ambassador will set out on his Return to Conftantinople about the latter End of this Month. Letters from Rome fay, that on the 14th Inftant Fifteen of our De-ferters were stopt there and conducted to Prifon, at the Requeft of Cardinal Acquaviva, in order to be delivered up, purfuant to the Articles of the Treaty of Accommodation between this Court and that of Rome.

Leghorn, Sept. 29. They write from Tri-poly, that M. Logie, the Swedifh Minister, has concluded a Treaty of Peace and Commerce with that Regency on the fame Foot-ing as the other Christian Powers. The Prefent which that Minister carried thither con-fisted of four Gold Watches, whereof two were fet with Diamonds, feveral Pieces of Plate, China and Cloths, thirty Pieces of Iron Cannon, with Ammunition, and a Cheft of finall Arms.
