Whitehall, October 27.

N Saturday last Captain Boys, Commander of the Ætna Fire Ship, arrived here Express with Letters from Vice-Admiral Vernon in Cumberland Harbour, formerly called Walthenam, on the South Side of the Island of Cuba, and from Major General Wentworth from his Camp on the said Island, bearing Date from the 18th of July to the 3d of September, and containing an Account. That on the 1st Day of July they set sail from Port Royal in Jamaica, and arrived the 18th of the same Month, with 41 Sail of Transports and Store Ships, and with his Majesty's Ships and Tenders, 61 Sail in all, at the Place abovementioned, where they had the Pleasure to find themselves possessed of the finest Harbour in the West Indies, capable of containing any Number of Shipping, and secure against Hurricanes; so which the Admiral immediately gave the Name of Cumberland, in Honour of his Royal Highness the Duke.

The Admiral immediately fent some light Vessels about five Leagues up the River. The Troops were landed and incamped by the 25th, from which Time the General had made several Detachments to reconnoitre and scour the Country, who had repulsed several advanced Guards of the Spatiards, and brought in plenty of Provisions for the Use of the Fleet and Army.

Both the Sea and Land Forces were posted in such a Manner, and such Preparations made for the Reception of the Enemy, that they were in no Apprehension as to the Security of the Possession they had taken, but were taking proper Measures, when the Letters came away, for advancing surther into the Country.

The Place of their Encampment was about 23 Leagues distant from St. Jago de Cuba. The Country which His Majesty's Forces have thus taken Possession of, is provided with a very fine fresh Water River; navigable for several Leagues, and abounding with Cattle and Provision.

The Admiral fends Word by this Express, that the Worcester, being on a Cruize, had taken and brought into Cumberland Handour, a Spanish Man of War of 24. Guns and 220 Men, which sailed the 29th of June from Port Passage, with Dispatches for the Vicerry of Mexico, but the Commander thereof

had thrown all his Letters overpaard before he was taken. This Ship was faid to be the Privateer who took our two Türkey hips in the Channel, and to have been purchased by the Crown of Spain, as a very extraordinary Sailor. Vice-Admiral Vernon mentions likewise, that he had received a Letter by the Deptford, from Captain Trevor, Commander of the Defiance, giving him an Account, that he had taken, off Rio la Hacha, a Ship of 350 Tons, 12 Guns, and 50 Mem, called the Providence, laden with Beef, Pork, Flour, Brandy, Wine, and Bar Iron, bound for Carthagena, and some dry Goods, which he supposes to be one of the Spanish Register Ships from Cadiz.

Petersbourg, Sept. 25, N.S. Letters from General Keith, Commander in Chief of the Ruthan Army in Finland, in the Absence of General Felt-Marshal Count Lacy, dated the 23d of September N. S. bring an Account, that on the 19th of September, a Detach-ment of Dragoons was fent a Foragii g up into the Enemy's Country as far as Welijoki, from whence they brought in a good Quantity of Forage and Bread for the Army. Whilst they were absent, a Swedish Deserter informed us, that, near the said Village of Welijoki, there was placed a Party of the Enemy, as well to reconnoitre our Army as to secure that Post; that they had broke down the Bridge over the little River of that Name, and were reinforced with some Dragoons and above an Hundred Foot from the Swedist main Army; and that they consisted in all of one Captain, five Lieutenants, one Enfigh, and 270 private Men. On the 2cth in the Evening, a Colone? with 100 of Ingerman's Costurin Horse Grenadiers, 150 Hullars, and a like Number of Dominich Cossars were detached with Orders to keep some Versts to the Right, and advance five or fix Wersts above the Village Welijoki, and then to go over the River, it being fordable thereabous, and fall upon the Enemy's Rear, while 200 Dragoons and 50 Hustars should made an Attack on this Side. On the 21st, about Seven in the Morning, as soon as this last Body of Hussars and Dragoons came within Sight of the Enemy, and the Hussars began to scour the Banks of the River and Fire upon the Swedes, they, without waiting for

the coming up of our Dragoons, immediately recreated towards Friederichshafen, whereupon our Collacks palled the River with all possible Expedition, both above and below the broken Bridge, and fell upon the Enemy before they could reach the Woods; and atcho' the Swedes had divided themselves into feveral Companies, that they might get the readier thro, the Woods, our Hullars made thift to destroy about 60 of them; and a Party of our Dragoons killed a whole Company of about 60 more, together with their commanding Officer. In this Action we commanding Officer. made 39 Prisoners, amongst which are two Lieutenants, three under Officers, and a Corporal of the Body Guard; we got besides a Booty of some sinall Artillery, three Drums, some Horses and a confiderable Number of Sheep and Oxen. A Detachment was sent after those of the Enemy who had escaped, but with little Success, only some of our Cossacks, who pursued the Enemy a great Way up the Country, made three Soldiers and one Drummer, Pissoners, and killed a few in the Pursuit. The Loss on our Side was only one Coffack killed; and one Hullar, one Collack and three Collack Horses wounds ed. It may be truly faid of our Hullars, that they behaved with the utmost Bravery in this Action. The Perlian Ambassador made his Entry this Morning, which was very maghificent, for besides 14 Elephants, with a Number of Indian and Negro Slaves to attend them, 'tis said his Retinue consisted of 2300 Persians, 1200 of which composed his Guard. The Swedish General Wrangel, and Major General Albreit will set out Tomorrow from Wibourg for this Place.

Hague, Oct. 31, N. S. On Saturday last the States of Holland separated, and are expected to return again within a Fortnight with definitive Instructions from their respective Towns relative to the present great Crisis of Europe, and to the Part the Republick shall act upon this Emergency. There have ving been a great Desertion in the French Army upon the Lower Rhine, and the French Ambaffador here being informed that feveral of the Deferters took Refuge in this Country, has put the States in Mind of the Cartel Sublisting between his most Christian Majesty and their High Mightinesser in Deserence to which Application, two of those Deserters have been arrested at Amsterdam, and several others at Deventer and other Frontier Towns. The Town of Cologne, which is summoned to receive near 12000 French Troops into Winter Quarters, has addressed itself to the States for their Protection; and their High Mightinesses have accordingly ordered their Ambassador at Paris to intercede with that Court in its behalf.
