**T**HIS being the Anniversary of his Majesty's Birth-Day, his Majesty received at Noon the Compliments of the Nobility, foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction. At Night there was a Ball. The Appearance was at both Times very numerous and extremely splendid. On this Occasion the Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired, and in the Evening there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and other publick Demonstrations of Joy throughout London and Westminster.

*Breslau, Oct. 21, N. S.* Felt Marshal Neuperg has quitted Silesia; and is retired with his Army into Moravia. The King has caused Neiss to be immediately invested with 10000 Men, under the Command of Prince Leopold of Dessau; so that that Place, the chief Strength of which is its Inundations, and in which there can be but a small Garrison, will not, according to Appearances, make any great Resistance in case of an Attack. Within this Fortnight or three Weeks the Hussars have in a manner remained quiet. Count Neuperg, before his Departure, ordered all Persons who were under civil Arrest at Neiss to be set at Liberty, with Permission to retire, and chose such Party as they should judge most convenient; among whom were the Counts Rader, Pikler, and some other Persons of Quality who were confined, upon their Parole, to the City of Breslau. These Gentlemen have their Estates in Upper Silesia. The 31st of this Month is fixed for receiving the Homage of the States of Lower Silesia, for which Purpose his Majesty is expected here. The said States are to appear, some of them personally, and others by their respective Deputies. The Battalions of the King's Regiment in Garrison here, will begin their March for Berlin To-morrow. The Winter Quarters in this Country are already settled, and it will not be long before the Army will go into them. The Austrian Army being entirely retired out of Silesia, and gone by Jagezendorff into Moravia, the King of Prussia has caused them to be followed by the Prussian Troops, who have accordingly entered Jagezendorff, Koniglich, and Neustadt,

whilst Prince Leopold of Dessau has been detach'd with a Body of 10000 Men towards the City of Neiss to begin the Siege of it; and Major General Wallrave, Commandant of Brieg, has received Orders to go to Neiss with the Artillery necessary for a Siege. It is not expected that the Place can make a very long Defence, and the rather, as Count Neuperg has taken out of it the greatest Part of the best Artillery. It is however thought the Garrison of Neiss consists of 6000 Men; and when the Prussian Troops invested it, they fired 10 Pieces of Cannon upon them. Some of the Deputies named by the States of Lower Silesia to do Homage to his Prussian Majesty are already arrived here. They hold frequent Conferences to regulate what they think convenient to obtain for the Preservation of the Privileges, Rights and Immunities, which the said States have always enjoyed. On the other Hand, they continue the necessary Preparations for this Ceremony, which according to what is reported, may be deferred longer than the 31st of this Month.

*Presbourg, Oct. 28, N. S.* The French and Bavarians have quite evacuated Lower Silesia, Marshal Torring having passed the Danube at Cremis with 10,000 Men, who are to join the others from Linz, at or about Neuhau in Bohemia, while another Body of French is entred into that Kingdom by Egra, where they may be stopped by a Garrison, as is said, of 1500 Men. Count Neuperg was at Olmitz on the 25th Instant, and the Great Duke with his Brother Iets qu on the 31st to meet him on this side of Braun; and Prince Lobkowitz is retired from Egra in order to join the main Army.

*Hubertsbourg, Oct. 29, N. S.* Baron Weissenbourg set out the 27th Instant for Frankfurt, as the chief of the Saxon Embassy for the Election of an Emperor. M. Brachel, Minister from the Czar of Muscovy, arrived last Week at Dresden on his Return to Berlin from Breslau, where he has been to claim the King of Prussia's Succour, as stipulated by Treaty against the Swedes, which his Prussian Majesty declined, being himself engaged in a War. Two Deputies of the Palatinates of Great Poland arrived here a few Days ago, and in their Audience of his Polish Majesty,

assured him, in the Name of their Principals, of their unalterable Fidelity and Attachment to the Person of their King, and constant Endeavours for the Prosperity of their Country. The Saxon Troops having broke up their Quarters at Torgaw and Eulenbourg, several Parties of them have been seen marching by this Place at different Times in the last Week, and are going, as is supposed, to take up fresh Quarters on the Frontiers of this Country towards Bohemia.

Hague, Nov. 3, N. S. The States General have disposed of the Post of Major at the Fort of Kurtzque, vacant by the Death of Colonel Heider, to Lieutenant Colonel du Tour; and that of Major at Grave, vacant by the Promotion of Colonel du Tour, to Captain Hompesch.

London, October 29.

Yesterday Sir Robert Godschall, Kt. Lord Mayor Elect for the Year ensuing, was sworn at Guildhall; when the Chair and other Emblems of Mayoralty were surrendered to him in the accustomed manner.

This Day the new Lord Mayor, accompanied by the late Lord Mayor, Aldermen, Recorder, and Sheriffs, in their Scarlet Gowns, went in their Coaches to the Water-Side, the Sword and Mace being carried before them, and the City Officers attending; and from thence proceeded in the City Barge, attended by the several Companies in their respective Barges adorned with Streamers and Pendants, to Westminster; and having walked round the Hall, and solemnly saluted all the Courts, they went to the Exchange Bar, and the Lord Mayor did there take the Oaths appointed, and having recorded Warrants of an Attorney in the proper Courts, returned by Water to Black-Fryers, and from thence in Coaches with the usual Solemnity to Guildhall, where a magnificent Entertainment was provided, at which were present the great Officers of State, divers of the Nobility, Lords of his Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, the Judges, and other Persons of Quality and Distinction.
