It is not expected that the Place can make a very long Defence, and the rather, as Count Neuperg has taken out of it the greatest Part of the beft Artillery. It is however thought the Garrison of Neiss confists of 6000 Men; and when the Pruffian Troops invefted it, they fired 10 Pieces of Cannon upon them. Some of the Deputies named by the States of Ldwer Silefia to do Homage to his Pruffian Majefty are already arrived here. They hold frequent Conferences to regulate what they think convenient to obtain for the Prefervathink convenient to obtain for the reletva-tion of the Privileges, Rights and Immuni-tics, which the faid States have always en-joyed. On the other Hand, they continue the necellarly Preparations for this Geremony, which according to what is reported, may be deferred longer than the 31st of this Month Month.
