THIS being the Anniverfary of his Majesty's Birth-Day, his Majesty received at Noon the Compliments of the Nobility, foreign Minifters, and other Perfons of Diftinction. At Night there was a Ball. The Appearance was at both Times very numerous and extremely fplendid. On this Occafion the Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired, and in the Evening there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and other publick Demonftrations of Joy throughout London and Weftminfter.

Breflau, Oct. 21, N. S. Felt Marfhal Neuperg has quitted Silefia; and is retired with his Army into Moravia. The King has caufed Neifs to be immediately invefted with 10000 Men, under the Command of Prince Leopold of Deffau; fo that that Place, the chief Strength of which is its Inundations, and in which there can be but a Small Garrifon, will not, according to Appearances, make any great Refiftance in cafe of an Attack. Within this Fortnight or three Weeks the Huffars have in a manner remained quiet. Count Neuperg, before his Departure, ordered all Perfons who were under civil Arreft at Neifs to be fet at Liberty, with Permittion to retire, and chufe fuch Party as they fhould judge moft convenient; among whom were the Counts Rader, Pikler, and fome other Perfons of Quality who were confined, upon their Parole, to the City of Breflau. Thefe Gentlemen have their Eftates in Upper Silefia. The 31ft of this Month is fixed for receiving the Homage of the States of Lower Silefia, for which Purpofe his Majesty is expected here. The faid States are to appear, fome of them perfonally, and others by their refpective Deputies. The Battallion of the King's Regiment in Garrifon here, will begin their March for Berlin To-morrow. The Winter Quarters in this Country are already fettled, and it will not be long before the Army will go into them. The Austrian Army being entirely retired out of Silefia, and gone by Jagezendorff into Moravia, the King of Pruffia has caufed them to be followed by the Pruffian Troops, who have accordingly entered Jagezendorff, Koniglich, and Neuffadt,

whilft Prince Leopold of Deffau has been detach'd with a Body of 10000 Men towards the City of Neifs to begin the Siege of it; and Major General Wallrave, Commandant of Brieg, has received Orders to go to Neifs with the Artillery neceffary for a Siege. It is not expected that the Place can make a very long Defence, and the rather, as Count Neuperg has taken out of it the greateft Part of the beft Artillery. It is however thought the Garrifon of Neifs confifts of 6000 Men; and when the Pruffian Troops invefted it, they fired 10 Pieces of Cannon upon them. Some of the Deputies named by the States of Lower Silefia to do Homage to his Pruffian Majesty are already arrived here. They hold frequent Conferences to regulate what they think convenient to obtain for the Prefervation of the Privileges, Rights and Immunities, which the faid States have always enjoyed. On the other Hand, they continue the neceffary Preparations for this Ceremony, which according to what is reported, may be deferred longer than the 31ft of this Month.

Prefbourg, Oct. 28, N. S. The French and Bavarians have quite evacuated Lower Silefia, Marfhal Torring having paffed the Danube at Cremis with 10,000 Men, who are to join the others from Lintz, at or about Neuhau in Bohemia, while another Body of French is entred into that Kingdom by Egra, where they may be ftopped by a Garrifon, as is faid, of 1500 Men. Count Neuperg was at Olmitz on the 25th Inftant, and the Great Duke with his Brother Iets qu on the 31ft to meet him on this Side of Braun; and Prince Lobkowitz is retired from Egra in order to join the main Army.

Hubertsbourg, Oct. 29, N. S. Baron Weiffenbourg fet out the 27th Inftant for Franckfort, as the chief of the Saxon Embaffy for the Election of an Emperor. M. Brachel, Minifter from the Czar of Mufcovy, arrived laft Week at Dresden on his Return to Berlin from Breflau, where he has been to claim the King of Pruffia's Succour, as ftipulated by Treaty againft the Swedes, which his Pruffian Majesty declined, being himfelf engaged in a War.
