Naples, October 10, N. S.

AS the Turkish Minister has in a genteel Manner refused to accept the Ship of War Parthenope, which was appointed to carry him back to Constantinople, the Court has freighted a Neapolitan and a Maltese Ship, which are both large Merchantmen, and are to carry the King's Colours; the former is to conduct the Turkish Minister, and the latter the Knight of Malta Majo, who is appointed the King's Minister Plenipotentiary at the Port, in the Room of M. Finocchietti who is recalled. On the 5th there was a splendid Appearance at Court on Occasion of the Queen's having entered into the fifth Month of her Pregnancy.

Rome, Oct. 14, N. S. Pere Augustin of Lugano, who is charged with the Ecclesiastical Affairs of the Queen of Hungary, &c. to the Pope, has lately received Instructions to represent, that as the Hungarians offer to engage all their Forces in Aid of the Queen, they required several Favours, for the Concession of which the Queen required the Pope's Consent. M. Sampario, the Portuguese Minister, has presented to the Pope a White Wolf Skin lined with Rose-colour Sattin, embroidered with Gold, which the Pope received very kindly.

Leghorn, Oct. 6, N. S. The Toulon Squadron is not yet sailed: This Squadron consists of 16 Men of War and five Store-ships, and only wait for their sailing Orders from the French Court. On the 9th his Britannick Majesty's Ship the Dursley, Captain Hughes Commander, sailed out of this Port on a Cruize. On the 10th the Regiment of Pallavicini Foot marched from this Garrison for Lombardy by the Lunigiana, and were this Day followed by that of Neiperg.

Florence, Oct. 17, N. S. On the 3d Instant Don Sancho de Luna, a Neapolitan Prince, was, by Order of the Regency, and at the Request of the Court of Naples, arrested at Prato, where he lately arrived in Company with the Wife of a Physician of the Court, whom he had clandestinely carried

away from Naples. The Prince was confined in the Old Castle, whence on the 7th he was removed to Orbitello, in order to be embarked for Naples; but the Woman still continues in the common Goal. On the 4th the Great Duke's Name-day was celebrated here with the usual Solemnity; the Ministers, Nobility, &c. appeared in rich Habits; Prince Craon entertained many of them at Dinner; and in the Evening there was an Assembly for the Ladies. On the 7th the Electress Dowager Palatine set out for the Convent della Quiete, where her Highness proposes to pass some Weeks. On the 9th five Soldiers of the Lorrain Regiment of Foot Guards deserted from the Old Castle. On the 15th a Party of 150 Hussars of Havor's Regiment passed through this City from Siena, on their March to Lombardy by the Way of Bologna, and were this Day followed by such another Party.

Breslau, Oct. 25. The King of Prussia continues the Siege of Neiss: His Majesty has insinuated to the Foreign Ministers, that if they deferred their Journey to Berlin till he was set out, they would find it difficult to have Relays. The French Minister is returned from the Camp. Prince William the King's Brother, and the Sieur Rothenbourg, have been declared Majors General. The States of Silesia are arriving here every Day in order to perform their Homage, which is deferred by reason of the Siege of Neiss. Yesterday Morning Mess. Feckel and Neubour, from Saxony, set out for the Camp.

Hubertsbourg, Nov. 1, N. S. M. Schonberg is appointed the first, and Baron Weissenberg the second of the Saxon Embassy for the Election of an Emperor.

Hague, Nov. 7, N. S. The Prince of Hesse Hombourg is come hither, in order to take the usual Oath to the States General as Governor of Breda. Baron Solenthal, Envoy from the Court of Denmark, and M. Hoffman, Secretary from that of Dresden, to the Court of Great Britain, propose passing over with this Mail to their Post at London. M. Alt, Minister from Hesse Cassel, is expected here To-morrow or next Day.
