Petersbourg, October 24, O. S.

WE have Accounts from our Army in Finland, that on the 17th of October the Regiments of Rostow and Welikoluki having been ordered for Wibourg, a Detachment of 1000 Men was sent for from thence to our Camp in their Stead. On the 8th we went on a general Forage, under the Convoy of 600 Foot and 300 Horse, who took one Cannon with them, in order to give the Signal to the Foragers if necessary and the rather, as we had Intelligence that the Enemy, on the other Side of the River Woxa, had made a Motion as if they intended to enter into our Frontiers, though it was not known how strong that Party was, nor to what Side they intended to turn. On the 9th, the Regiment of Dragoons of Ingria was ordered for Wibourg, and from thence into Winter Quarters. The better to cover the Frontiers about Kexholm, a Detachment from the Regiment of Dragoons of Jamburg, and some Don Cossacks, were sent this Day to join the Troops that are there. On the 10th nothing remarkable happened. On the 11th we had Advice by a Deserter, that the Enemy had divided their Army; only four Regiments of Foot and two of Dragoons remaining near Iridrichsham under the Command of Count Lowenhaupt, the rest, with two Generals, having marched to Kumisch by the Tawasthus Road. On the 12th we had Intelligence, that the Enemy, to the Number of 1000 Men, had appeared near Peter's Church, and were there laying a Bridge over the Woxa, of which Advice was immediately sent to the Detachment posted near Kexholm, and other necessary Dispositions were made. On the 13th Advice came in from Kexholm, that on the 5th Instant our Don Cossacks, with their Colonel Sebrakow and 40 Dragoons, had passed the Enemy's Frontiers and done great Damage; they began with the Village Iimy, where there is a Swedish Church, went round by Redijerwy, and so on almost as far as Peter's Church, and from thence returned to the Parish of Kirbur, having entirely ruined a great many Villages, and brought away two Dragons and some other Prisoners.

Petersbourg, Oct. 27. We hear from Finland, that the Russian Army is now entirely separated and gone into Winter Quarters.

Naples, Oct. 31, N. S. On the 15th Instant the Turkish Minister had a private Audience of the King at Portici, in which he took his Leave on his Return to Constantinople; accordingly on the 18th he embarked on board a Merchant Ship hired by the Court to conduct him thither. The same Day the Chevalier de Malta Major, Envoy Extraordinary of the King to the Post, embarked on board another Merchant Ship hired also by the Court, and that Evening they set sail together for Constantinople. On the 20th a Courier was dispatched by the Court to Constantinople, by the Way of Ragusi, with Notice of the Departure of the Turkish Minister and M. Major. On the 22d express Orders came here from the Court at Portici, to fit out the Ships of War St. Phillip and Parthenope; to prepare the Train of Artillery, Ammunition, and Military Stores, which were lately ordered to be laid up in the Magazines; and for some Battalions of Foot to hold themselves in Readiness for a March 'tis said on an Expedition, but where designed is not yet known. On the 25th the Anniversary of the Queen of Spain's Birthday was celebrated with the usual Solemnity, the Foreign Ministers, Nobility and Military Officers having, on that Occasion, repaired to Court in rich Habits to pay their Compliments to their Majesties; many of them were entertained at Dinner by M. de Montallegre; and in the Evening there was a triple Discharge of the Artillery from the Castles.

Leghorn, Nov. 10. The last Letters from Corsica import, that the Genoese Commissary had summoned the Inhabitants on the other Side of the Mountains to lay down their Arms; which they not only refused to do, but have also refused to pay any Taxes.

Florence, Nov. 12. On the 1st Instant four Soldiers of the Lorrain Regiment of Foot Guards deserted when on duty at one of the City Gates; as did on the 2d the whole Picquet of them, consisting of 13 Men with their Arms, at another Gate.

Vienna, Nov. 11, N. S. The Empress Amelia returned to her Convent here on the 8th Instant. The same Day Count Khevenhuller returned likewise from Presbourg, where he had been to assist at a military Conference. Count Salaburg, the general Commissary of the Army, set out on the
