THE Expectations of a general Battle feem at least suspended. The Austrians are said to retire, and the Confederates to think of Winter Quarters, which the Want of Forage about Prague obliges them to fearch farther in the Country and in separate Corps; for that Part of Bohemia near the Capital, having furnished Marshal Neuperg's in Silesia with Provifions all last Summer, is now so drained, that there is little but Rye lest. The Saxon Troops are all drawn out of Prague, excepting one Regiment; and the Elector of Bavaria remains there with a confiderable Number of his, intending, as it is reported, to be immediately proclaimed King of Bohemias It is faid, that most of the Prisoners taken at Prague, are enrolled in the Saxon Troops. His Polish Majesty has been pleased to grant that two new Regiments of Foot of 1500 Men each, should be raised by the Counts Bruhl and Belgarde. M. Dugne, the French Com-millary, is now return'd with all the Saxon Artillery, sent from hence for the Siege of Prague, excepting fix 24 Pounders, fix 12 Pounders, and two Mortars, that were so far advanced when the Town was taken, that it was thought more adviceable to leave them there for the present, than to have them

Dresden, Nov. 10, N. S. The 8th Instant being the Anniversary of her Polish Majesty's Birth day, the same was celebrated in the usual Manner: At Noon their Majesties dined in publick, with all the Nobility and Foreign Ministers, to whom Count Bruhl gave a most sumptuous Entertainment in the Evening. By a Letter from Prague we are informed, that the Consederates have lodged a Thousand of their Sick in the Jesuits College.

Petersbourg, Nov. 10. The Felt Marshal Lacy has received an Express from a Lieute, nant Colonel of Hussars, giving him an Account, that he had penetrated, at the Head of 200 Men of his Corps, supported by 50 Dragoons, on the Nyslod Side, into Finland, where they had ravaged 60 Versts of that Country, burnt 300 Villages, massacred all the Inhabitants who made any Resistance, consumed all the Forage, and drove away all the Cattle they sound, and that they had met with but one Swedish Post of about 12 Men, who immediately retired on their Ap-

proach, and that he was returned without the Loss of one Man, and with about 20 Prifoners. By an Express arrived lately from Man Kaluhkin, Minister of this Court in Persia, we have Advice, that Schach Nadir has received a considerable Blow from the Highlanders of the Province of Dagestan, who border upon Georgia, and had some Years ago revolted from the Schach, who in this Action is said to have lost by Mortality and the Sword upwards of 25000 Men. The Winter is tome on here so sast within this sast Week, that the Gallies which were designed to transport Provisions, Stores, and Ammunition to Wibourg, are actually shut up at Cronstadt.

Petersbourg, Nov. 14. General Keith arrived here the 11th from Wibourg, but heing only come to make his Court, he proposes, to return to his Quarters in three or four Days. M. Gestemost, at the Head of a Party of his Cossacks, has made a second Irruption. by Kexholm into Finland, where he has ra-vaged a confiderable Tract of that Country. and after having met with several small Bodies either of Peasants or Recruits, for they were dressed in Soldiers Cloaths, of which he cut off about 70, and returned with 36, Prisoners, besides 24 Women and Children, and 500 Head of black Cattle, 76 Horses, and a great Number of Sheep: And by the Letters arrived fince, he is fet out again on a third Expedition. There are five Regiments of Huslars posted at Olonitz, under the Command of Major General Kinderman and Brigadier Shippanoff. A Draught of all the Grenadiers out of the Regiments on the other Side of the Country, consisting of 46 Companies of 140, besides five Regiments of what they call the Persian Corps, are expected at Moscow, where they will winter, and march hither in the Spring, and will compose a Body of 15000 Men, the choicest in the Service. To-morrow there will be a splendid Appearance, and Ball at Court, on account of the Duke of Mecklenbourg, the
