" or Receipt, either for Money or Goods, with Intention to defraud any Person, knowing the same to be salfe, forged, or counterfeited, then every such Person being " thereof law, of counterferce, then every just i erfon verng "thereof law, fully convisted according to the due Courfs of Law, shall be deemed guilty of Felony, and fuf-"fer Death as a Felon, without Benefit of Clergy." Upon which Indistment the faid Dominick Fitzgerald and James Lee were both convisted, and have been fince executed for the said Offence. The faid Commiffi-oners publish this to inform all Persons what soever, that by the said Statute, any Perfon that falfely makes, forges, or counterfeits, or causes or procures to be fullely made, forged, or counterfeited, or willingly acts or affifts in the falfe making, forging, or counterfeiting the Will, Letter of Attorney, or Bill of Sale of any Seaman or Seamen, or any Ticket for Seamen's Wages, or that up ters or publifhes as true, any false, forged, or conster-feited Will, Letter of Attorney, Bill of Sale, or Tic-ket of any Seaman or Seamen, is guilty of Felonds; and being convoited thereof, will fuffer Death as a Felond without Lenefit of Clergy: And for the discovering of Persons guilty of these Offences, the said Commissioners do hereby promise to reward any Person or Persons that Ball make juch Discovery, upon the Conviction of any Person or Persons guilty thereof.
