Constantinople, January 23.

Reports vary again about the State of Things in Persia; it is now much doubted if the Ottoman Ambassador has had his Audiences of the Shaugh, whose real Designs seem still very uncertain: He is said to be somewhere about Tabreez. The Orders about the Dress of Christians and Jews are again renewed, certain Colours and Furs, and particular Fashions, of which is a great Variety here, are forbid them, and those who are found transgressing, are carried to the Vizier's Palace, where their Cloaths are cut to Pieces, and they are bastinated. The Drugomans and immediate Dependence of the Foreign Ministers are dispensed with. The Tunis Rovers incommode greatly the French Navigation in these Seas, and have taken some Vessels in the very Ports of the Morea and Archipelago. One of them, after having done a great deal of Mischief, shut up several French Vessels in the Port of Scio. It is said, that upon Application to the Porte, a Frigate is departing to order them to quit these Seas.

Petersbourg, Feb. 8. The Czarina has ordered every thing to be ready by the 20th of this Month for her Journey to Moscow. M. Lilliefeldt, who accompanied Prince Lewis as far as Mittau, returned hither the 6th. The Prince was permitted to see his Brother and Sister in Law at Riga, but they are not allowed to see one another. The two Children of the late Princess Regent have had the Small Pox there, and are recovered. Mr. Finch, late Minister Plenipotentiary from his Britannick Majesty, having had his Audiences of Leave of the Czarina, set out from hence this Afternoon on his Return home.

Vienna, Feb. 28, N. S. There is no other News from Bavaria, except that Count Khevenhuller has made a Detachment of four Regiments of Foot, and two of Horse, to reinforce Prince Charles and Prince Lobkowitz, in order to enable them to put a Stop to the King of Prussia's Progress in Moravia and Lower Austria. M. Polastron, with the 3000 French under his Command, is retired out of Moravia to join Marshal Broglio. This Court has now in its Service, of the Hungarian Insurrection, six Regiments of Infantry amounting to 18000 Men, four of Cavalry 4000, Portarists 2000, Nobility 10000, three old Regiments of Hungarian Infantry 9000, eight Regiments of Hussars 8000, Croates of Waradin 8000, ditto of Carlstadt 9000, Slavonians 3000, Pandours, Rascians, &c. 3000, in all Seventy-four Thousand.

Berlin, March 6. The Austrian Hussars have lately carried off two of the King of Prussia's Postillions, who were bringing Letters to this Place. The last Accounts we had of his Prussian Majesty were from Znaim, but he is soon expected at Olmutz, and 'tis said, he will be here towards the End of this Month, but that is very uncertain.

Dresden, March 7. There is Advice that a Prussian Regiment has been cut to Pieces by the Hussars in Upper Silesia, where the Inhabitants of the Krapach Mountains, who live in those Frontiers by running of Salt, have, on obtaining an Amnesty from the Court of Vienna, formed a Corps of 5 or 6000 Men for the Service of the House of Austria.

Hague, March 15. It is reported here, that the King of Prussia had retreated to Olmutz; and we have Advice that Marshal Broglio had abandoned Piseck and Frauenberg.
