The Smedes Enveyé is still pressing his Imperial Majesty to interpose his Authority, for the execution of the Treaty of Munter, in order to his Musters pretentions upon the City of Bremen, which affair is referred to the consideration of the Council.

For the final composure of the differences between Mantia and Modena, the Emperor has sent the Seignfor Counce de Vindisgraiz, who is to give his M jesty a full account of their whole business, and to take a view of the place in controvers: 3 effer which, his Imperial Mejesty will proceed to a Definitive Sentence, and settle a firm peace between them.

Rome, July 31. The Governor of Milan continues at Finale, every day expecting the arrival of the Empiels from Barcellona, who has made a longer flay there then was at first expected, to employ the benefit of the sire of that place, where she is well accommodated with all previsions and conveniencies. She has had there a fit or two of her Ague, but her Train bath suffered much by the ill air of Denia, about 42 persons dying out of it, among whom the Counce's de Benezente, with other Ladies of quality, and the Major Domo to the Duke d'Albuquerque 3 nor have the Gallies fared much better, who have lost above 200 persons aboard them, and a great number of those that remain sick. Din Carlo Loria, Brother to St. Pagano, who commands the Squairon of the Duke di Tursi, being I kewise dead.

We have lately news brought us by a Feluca from Parcellona, that the Empress was when he came thence, ready to Embark; and by the P. S., we are informed, she is arrived at Finale. But of this we expect further confirmation.

Edeaburgh, August 16. Yesterday was Proclaimed a General day of Thanks iving to be kept throughout this Kingdom on the 23 of this Month, so the Great Victory is pleased God to give His Mojesties Fleet against the Dutch.
