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## From Chursday August 28, to Bunday September 1, 1673.

Warfam, Aug. 15. T may well be expected we should at last be able to advile you of the resolution of this Crown as to a War with the Turks, the Summer being fo far advanced, that there will, remain but little time for any action, in cafe any be intended, but we are fill in the dark as to this matter ; yet though we cannot politively fay, what our Superiors have refolved, what we guels by their proceedings, is, That in cafe the Turks do not give us any disturbance, we shall be willing to fit ftill this year, to prepare our felves the better for a War against the next, and therefore having receiv ved advice, that those Ottomar Troops which had paf- ' fed the Danube, under the Command of the Grand Vizier, were marched back again, and that there is nor any appearance of an Invalion from them this Summer, our Forces march with a flower pace to-wards the Rendezvous on the Frontiers of Ruísia, and the Crown General Sobietyki, who once intended to have been there the beginning of this month, thinks there is as yet no great occasion for his Prefence, and therefore is gone to Biala, the Refidence of Prince Radgevil, to pais some short time there : and in the interim, we are wholly ignorant when the King will fet forward to he Army, which it is refolved shall be brought together, though it be without any intention to employ them, whilit we hope to have this advantage by it, to keep the Enemy from attempting any thing upon us, which perhaps they would otherwife do, should they not fee us in a posture of detence. Here is arrived another Envoy from the Czar of Mojcovy, who with much earnestnofs, encourages us to a War with the Port, in the profequion of which, he promiles the Conjunction of the Farces of the Czar his Mafter, and that they shall act with all the vigor polible, for the endeavoring to remove this Common Enemy from their Frontiers.

- Florence, Aug. 16. The Cardinal Leopol de Medicit, who hath been of late very much indifposed, is at present much recovered, to the great fatistaction of this Court. The Court of Spain, as we are told, pretched that because of the promotion of Signior Nerli to the Cardinalate, whill Refa-dent in France, they bught likewife to have a nomi-nation of a Cardinal. The Crown of Poi nd cond-nues to reprefent to his Holinefs, the great danger they are in of an Invalian from the Turks and on that account follicites a confiderable affittance from hences

though as yet nothing is done in it. Vienna, Aug. 25. From Egra we have advice, that the 18 inftant his Imperial Majefty arrived there, having been met by the Elector of Sax ny, and the young Prince his Son stand that the concourfe of Per-fons of the chiefeft quality was fo great there, that it was a hard matter to procure them all Lodgings in the Town; that the 203 the general Rendezvous of the Army was to be, which according to the particulars we have formerly g ven, will confift in all in about 40000 Men ; and that then in few days after, the Army would break up from thence, and begin to march : In the mean time we cannot yet certainly fay how they intend to proceed; mo. People fear, their march may occasion more harm then good to the Empire, in making it the Seat of the War. The Elector of *Treves* we hear, complains highly of the damage his Terri-tories have received from the French, though they feem with good reafon to excufe themfelves, and lay the blame upon those, who thus force them for the fecurity of their own affairs, to act as they do. The Emperors Marriage with the Archdutchefs of Infpruck, will be certainly celebrated about the middle of October next.
