my at Seven in the Morning, the Prullian Cavalry had been entirely beaten and put to Flight by the Austrian Horse, and that their Huslars made themselves Masters, during the Action, of all the Pruffian Baggage, even that of the King, and carried it off. But that the Pruffian Foot having maintained themfelves in their advantageous Poft, Prince Charles, who is faid to be flightly wounded, had caufed a Retreat to be founded at Eleven in the Morning, and retired in good Order without being purfued a fingle Step. The faid Prince however left five Pieces of Cannon behind him. The Courier having crofied the Field of Battle, adds, that there might be on both Sides about 5 or 6000 killed, and that the two Armies were pretty near equal in Number, viz. each confifting of upwards of 30000 Men.
