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Alborough, September 8.

Yesterday sayled by this place for the River of *Thames*, the great Fleet of laden Colliers, being in all near 400 Sails; they parted from *Newcastle* with their Convoy the third instant, and are come so far on their way, without meeting any Enemy.

Harwich, Sept. 9. The great Fleet of laden Colliers are come into *Hoassly Bay* and the *Sledway*, and are now under Sail for the River of *Thames*, the Wind S. W. Yesterday in the evening, that part of the Fleet of Merchant Men, which could not pass over the *Flats*, came to an Ankor with their Convoy in the *Gunfleet*, from whence they failed this Morning towards the *Buoy of the Nore*.

Genova, Aug. 12. The Levies which have been made here for his most Christian Majesty, are now compleat, and begin to march towards that Kingdom; The Galley of this State is still detained at *Marseilles*, though frequent addresses have been made to the Court of *France* on this account, his Majesty being not as yet fully satisfied with the proceedings of this State; Signior *Durazzo* is preparing to go thither in quality of Envoy Extraordinary, and we hope his Negotiation will have the desired effect, in reconciling all differences between his Majesty and this State. The Duke d' *Ossuna* being recalled from the Government of *Milan*, we are told that the Prince de *Ligne*, now Viceroy of *Sicily*, will shortly arrive here on his way thither, being to succeed the Duke d' *Ossuna* in that Government.

Warsaw, Aug. 22. The Kings journey for *Rubieslaw* on the Frontiers of *Russia*, is again put off till the 27 of this Month, and the general review of our Forces till the beginning of the next Month, by reason the Grand Marshal *Sobieski* cannot be there at the time at first prefixed. The Envoy from the Czar of *Muscovy* is gone home again, with ample assurances from the King, of his readiness to correspond with the intentions of the Czar, in relation to a War with the Turks, to which end his Majesty will in a very short time have an Army of 38 thousand Men on foot, viz. 12000 of the old Militia, 6000 from *Lithuania*, and 20000 new raised Men, which Forces, when joined with those of *Muscovy*, may be sufficiently able to recover what we have formerly lost; which according to our advices from the Port, they there begin to apprehend, and to desire a confirmation of the present Peace, and we are told, that the Grand Signior has authorized Commissioners to Treat with such as shall be appointed by this Crown, for the renewing the late Treaty, he being willing to letve out the Article which obliges a yearly sum of Money to be paid to him by way of *Tribute*; but in the mean time we begin to think that we shall better find our account in a War, since the *Muscovites* with so much cordiality offer us their assistance, which opportunity should we now neglect, and give the Czar leisure to cool again, we must despair of meeting in hañt with the like opportunity to recover our selves of *Grimice*, and other places now in the hands of the Turks. The Queen had once in-

ended to accompany his Majesty this Campagne, but the being at present somewhat indisposed, it hath been resolved that her Majesty shall continue here. Here is arrived a Courier from the Cham of *Tartary*, with Letters to the King, in which he desires the payment of the yearly sum of Money, heretofore paid him, on which condition he offers to assist this Crown with what Force he can.

Vienna, Aug. 30. From *Egra* we have now a particular account of the general review of the Imperial Army; viz. that the 22 instant it was drawn up in *Batalia* on a very large Plain, being divided into two Bodies, the first was Commanded by the Duke de *Bournonville*, Marechal de Camp General, General *Spork* Commanding the right wing of the Cavalry, and Prince *Charles* of *Lorraine* the left wing; the Infantry being Commanded by Prince *Pis*, and Count *Fortia*; this Body was composed of the Regiments of *Montecuculi*, *Spork*, and *Lorraine*. Cavalry; the Regiment of *Gortschy*, Dragoons; the Regiments of *Pis*, *Knigge*, *Portia*, and *Leslie*, Infantry; and the Regiments of *Heister*, *Holstein*, *Caprara*, and *Harrani*, Cavalry: The second Body was Commanded by General *Vertmiller*, likewise Marechal de Camp, the right wing of which was Commanded by the Count de *Caprara*, Lieutenant Marechal de Camp, and the left wing by the Count de *Chavignac*, General or *Battailles*, the Regiments of this Body were, of *Zeu* (at present *Bournonville*) *Rabata*, *Dunewald*, Horse; of *Szarebergh*, *Grana*, and of *Strein*, Foot; and of *Serini*, young *Holstein*, and *Gallas*, Horse; The Train of Artillery consisted of 36 pieces of Cannon and four Mortar-pieces, of which Prince *Herman*, Marquis of *Baen* is General; This whole Army being Commanded by Count *Montecuculi*, as Generalissimo.

Francfort, Sept. 6. Our advices tell us that the Imperial Army is coming down towards these parts, and that General *Spork* is arrived with the Van-Guard at *Wurzburg* on the *Main*; In the mean time we hear that Monsieur de *Turenne* is passing his Troops over that River at *Aschaffenbourg*, his Artillery having already passed it; that he has at present his Head-Quarter at *Hurstein*, but intends to remove from thence, and march as far as *Werrheim* on the *Main*, four Leagues from *Wurzburg*; In the mean time he hath put a good Garrison in the Castle at *Aschaffenbourg*; and appointed 1000 Dragoons to secure the Bridge there. The Town of *Treves* hath at last surrendered to the French.

Cologne, Sept. 8. From *Maastricht* some days since Marched two Regiments of Foot, towards the Electorate of *Treves*; The French we hear continue the Siege of *Meyen*, a strong place belonging to that Elector; The Chevalier de *Fourilles*, who Commands the French Forces in those parts, is Decamped from *Witlich*, and has lately passed the *Moselle* near *Phalzgel*, where about the same time the Marquis de *St. Clas* likewise passed with a considerable Reinforcement of Horse towards his Majesty in *Alsia*. The Emperors Army being divided into three Bodies, had according to our last advices, their head Quarters at *Prestat*, having removed them from *Nuremberg*, which place they in-
