Alborough, September 8.

Esterday sayled by this place for the River of Thames, the great Fleet of laden Colliers, being in all near 400 Sayl; they parted from Newcastle with their Convoy the third instant, and are come so iar on their

way, without meeting any Enemy.

Harwich, Sept. 9. The great Fleet of laden Colliers are come into Hoally Bay and the Stedway, and are now under Sail for the River of Thames, the Wind S. W. Yesterday in the evening, that part of the Fleet of Merchant Men, which could not pass over the Flats, came to an Ankor with their Convoy in the Gunfleet, from whence they failed this Morning towards the Buoy

of the Nore.

Genoua, Aug. 12. The Levies which have been made here for his most Christian Majesty, are now complear, and begin to march towards that Kingdom; The Galley of this State is still detained at Marfeilles, though frequent addresses have been made to the Court of France on this account, his Majesty being nor as yet fully satisfied with the proceedings of this State; Signior Duraz-20 is preparing to go thither in quality of Envoye Ttraordinary, and we hope his Negotiation will have the defired effect, in reconciling all differences between his Majesty and this State. The Duke d'Ossuna being recalled from the Government of Milan, we are told that the Prince de Ligne, now Vicercy of Sicily, will shortly arrive here on his way thither, being to succeed the Duke d' Offuna in that Government,

Warfam, Aug. 22. The Kings journey for Rubief-fam on the Frontiers of Russia, is again put off till the 27 of this Month, and the general review of our Forcestill the beginning of the next Month, by reason the Grand Marethal Sobietski cannot be there at the time at first prefixed. The Envoy from the Czar of Muscowy is gone home again, with ample affurances from the King, of his readiness to correspond with the intentions of the Czar, in relation to a War with the Turks; to which end his Majesty will in a very short time have an Army of 38 thousand Men on foot, viz. 1 2000 of the old Militia, 6000 from Lithuania, and 20000 new raised Men, which Forces, when joyned with those of Mescovy, may be sufficiently able to recover what we have formerly loft; which according to our advices from the Port, they there begin to apprehend, and to defire a confirmation of the present Peace, and we are told, that the Grand Signior has authorifed Commissioners to Treat with such as shall be appointed by this Crown, for the renewing the Fate Treaty, he being willing to letve out the Article which obliges a yearly fum of Money to be paid to him By way of Tribue; But in the mean time we begin to think that we shall better find our account in a War, fince the Mufcovires with fo much cordiality offer us their assistance, which opportunity should we now negleft, and give the Czar leifure to cool again, we mult despair of meeting in hast with the like opportunity to reposless our selves of Oiminies, and other places now tin the hands of the Turks. The Queen had once sinended to accompany his Majesty this Campagne, but the being ar present somewhat indisposed, it bath been resolved that her Majesty shall continue here. Here is arrived a Courrier from the Cham of Tartary, with Letters to the King, in which he defires the payment of the yearly fum of Money, heretofore paid him, on which condition he offers to affift this Crown with what

Vienna, Aug. 30. From Egra we have how a particular account of the general review of the Imperial Army; viz. that the 22 instant it was drawn up in Battalia on a very large Plain, being divided into two Bodies, the first was Commanded by the Duke de Bournonville, Mareschal de Camp General, General Spork Commanding the right wing of the Cavalry, and Prince Charles of Lorrain the left wing; the Infantry being Commanded by Prince Pis, and Count Fortia; this Body was composed of the Regiments of Montecuculi, Spork, and Lorrain. Cavalry; the Regiment of Gortshy, Dragoons; the Regiments of Pis, Knigge, Portia, and Leflie, Infantry, and the Regiments of Heifter, Holftein, Caprara, and Harrant, Cavalry: The second Body was Commanded by General Vertmiller, like-wife Mareschal de Camp, the right wing of which Commanded by the Count de Caprara, Lieute-nat Mareschal de Camp, and the left wing by the Count de Chavainac, General or Battaille, the Regiments of this Body were, of Zen (at present Bournonville) Rabata, Dunewald, Horse; of starembergh, Grana, and of Strein, Foot; and of Serini, young Holstein, and Gallas, Horse; The Train of Artillery confilted of 36 pieces of Cannon and four Mortarpieces, of which Prince Herman, Marquis of Bauen is General; This whole Army being Commanded by Count Montecuculi, as Generalistimo.

Francfort, Sept. 6. Our advices tell us that the Imperial Army is coming down towards these parts, and that General Spork is arrived with the Van-Guard at Wirtzburg on the Main; In the mean time we hear that Monsieur de Turenne is passing his Troops over that River at Aschaffenbourg, his Artillery having already passed it; that he has at present his Head-Quarter at Hurstein, but intends to remove from thence, and march as far as Wertheym on the Main, four Leagues from Wurtzburg; In the mean time he hath put a good Garrison in the Castle at Aschaffenhourgs and appointed 1000 Dragoons to secure the Bridge there. The Town of Treves hath at last furren-

dred to the French.

Cologne, Sept. 8. From Macstricht some days since Marched two Regiments of Foot, towards the Electorate of Traves; The French we hear continue the Siege of Meyen, a strong place belonging to that Elector; The Chevalier de Fourilles, who Commands the French Forces in those parts, is Decamped from Witlick, and has lately paffed the Mofelle near Phalizel, where about the same time the Marquis de St. Clas likewise passed with a considerable Reinforcement of Horse towards his Majesty in Alfaria.
