E have Advice that Vice-Admiral Bredal, with a Squadron of Seven large Ships of War and Nine Frigats, coming from Archangel and Kola, has palled the Sound; and it is probable that by this Time he has joined the other Ruffian Squadron in the Baltick.

From the General Quarters in Bavaria near Ober Altach, Sept. 12.

Lieutenant Colonel Trenck, having got Poffeflion of Vichtach, was detached by Felt Marfhal Khevenhuller to go to Cham, and endeavour to make himfelf Mafter of it, as being one of the beft Towns in Bavaria. The aforefaid Gentleman having marched immediately, went thither to fummon the Commandant of the Place Colonel Count Kunigl, who was there with a Battalion of Bavarians, and gave him to underftand, That being comprehended in the Capitulation of Lintz, he ought to quit the Town, and go into the open Country of the Palatinate, conformably to the faid Capitulation ; which he refuling, Count Khevenhuller wrote him a Letter ; after which, he demanded ufome Time to reflect upon it, which Baron Twenck granted him. In the mean time iwo Men of Baron Trenck's Detachment having advanced too near the Town, they fired at them, and wounded one dangeroully, having fhot him through the Body: The Behegers having committed this firft Hoftility, Baron Trenck demanded Satisfaction for it • To which coloner K unigh having answered, That it had been done without his Knowledge, and cohtrary to his Orders, Trenck infilted upon a Cathegorical Answer, whether he would evar suate the Place on not : Which, the other has using utefuled, Eretick infilted upon a Cathegorical Answer, whether he would evar suate the Place on not : Which the other has using utefuled, Eretick made forme Motions as if he intended to go away; which occasioned great Joy in the Town, and immediately Mutick was heard from all their Towers. mean while Lieutenant Colonel Trenck went to another Side of the Town, and fell into the Suburbs, where indeed they fired briskly on him, but without discouraging him. Whilst he was employed in fetting Fire to the Suburbs, and that they were firing at him from all Sides of the Town, one of those Houses catched Fire ; which Lieutenant Colonel Trenck perceiving, he gave Orders to fire against this House, as well with Muskets as small Field Pieces, in order to drive away those who were endeavouring to put it out. The Wind; in a flort Time, increased the Flames to fo great a Degree, that the whole Town was quickly reduced to Afhes, little more than one Church being left The Commandant not be-ing able to walk, having the Gout, remained in the Town with his Grenadiers, but the reft of the Garrifon were gone out on the oppofite Side. But as foon as Lieutenant Colonel Trenck was informed of it, he purfued them, and made them an Offer of Pardon's which they accepted of with Joy, having directly laid down their Arms, and entreated, as a Favour, to be received into the Queen of Hungary's Service, having excufed themfelves for their Ignorance about the Capitulation of Lintz, fome of their Officers having totation of Linz, tome of their Onders having told them, that it was no longer in Forcer. With this Battalion they took five Pair of Co-lours, and found in the Town Eleven Pieces of Cannon.
