South Carolina, July 26.

N Friday laft the Pilot Boat, which was fent to Virginia by the Governor with the firft News of the Spanifh Invation, returned hither; fhe left Virginia the t2th Inftant, and brings an Account, that Captain Dandridge; in his Majefty's Ship the South-Sea Caftle, of 40 Guns, would fail in two Days after to the Relief of General Oglethorpe. The faid Captain was just returned from a Cruize, and having all his Men ready on board, had nothing to do but to take in forme more Wood and Water.

On Saturday News eame, that on Sight only of the Flamborough, Swift, and Hawk Men of War, and the Beauford Galley, which appeared off the Bar of St. Simon's the 13th Inftant, the Spaniards betook themfelves to their Veffels with the utmost Confusion, and left the General again Master of the Island.

Vienna, Oct. 6, N. S. Count Seckendorff is fuppoled to be with his 9000 Men as this Day in the Neighbourhood of Munich. The two Armies in Bohemia remain still in the fame Situation. A Defign formed on the 1st Instant to attack the Enemy's Left Wing, was prevented by the Informations of Deferters. Colonel Trenk with 500 Men, has defeated a Party of 300 Grenadiers; they were abandoned by 500 Dragoons, fo that the Grenadiers were all cut to pieces, and the Officers taken Prifoners. M. de Belliss is ill at Prague. Count Richecourt fets out To-morrow for Berlin, and Count Elterhaly, who is named for Dresden, will fet out in a few Days.

Geneva, Öctober 9. N. S. On the 30th paft the King of Sardinia arrived at Aofte, and continued there till the 4th Inftant, on which Day he fet out at Four in the Morning, and lay that Night at la Tuile, fituated at the Foot of the Jittle Mount St. Bernard. His Sardinian Majefty was attended by five hundred Horfemen

and most of his Guards, having left only a fmall Number of them at Turin. The Body of the Army which arrives by Morienne, together with that part which has already passed by the little Mountain St. Bernard, confists of 26 Battallions and 12 Squadrons. The Infant Don Philip is retired to Mian, which lies between Montmellian and the Fortress of Barreau, at the Entrance into Dauphiné.

Drefden, October 10. Marshal Maillebois marched the 6th with his Army to Eger, and was followed by the Austrians, who endeavour to cut off the Communication, at least to prevent the Junction with the French in and about Prague.

Drefden, October 10, N. S. The following is a Relation given by Colonel Mentzel of his late Operations in Bohemia.

Mentzel of bis late Operations in Bohemia. By Orders of his Royal Highnefs the Great Duke, I march'd on the 28th of September from the Army, with the Corps under my Command, in order to diflodge a Party of the Enemy of 600 Horfe and fix Companies of Grenadiers; who were pofted near the Village of Oberfichtigfer, where Marfhal Maillebois, Monfieur d'Harcourt, Count Saxe, and feveral other General Officers were then in Perfon; I foon came within Sight of the French, who immediately drew themfelves up in order of Battle, and I commanded my Artillery to advance with all poffible Expedition, and about Eleven o'Clock begun the Attack, by which I obliged the Enemy to give Ground, and the Generals to retreat with Precipitation; but their Troops feturn'd five Times to the Charge, and the Grenadiers behaved well, till they faw that the Cavalry was routed, and then the Flight became géneral ; The Infantry endeavoured to reach the faid Village of Oberfichtigfer, but not above 50 of them elcaped the Huflars. A Lieutenant Colo, nel of the Dragoons, Lacofte, a Captain and Lieutenant of the Grenadiers, as alfo a Trumpeter, a Drummer, and 60 private Men, became Prifoners of War; and the next Day a Captain
