### Westminster, November 18.

IS Majesty came this Day to the Houfe of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes, feated on the Throne with the ufual Solemnity, Sir Charles Dalton, Gentleman Ufher of the Black Rod, was fent with a Meffage from his Majefty to the Houfe of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the Houfe of Peers; the Commons being come thither accordingly, his Majefty was pleafed to make the following most gracious Speech:

#### My Lords and Gentlemen,

THE prefent important Conjuncture of Affairs will, I am perfuaded, be thought a fufficient Reafon, for calling you thus early together.

I have, in purfuance of the repeated Advice of my Parliament, taken fuch a Parts as appeated to me molt conducive to the Support of the House of Austrias and to the Restoring and Securing the Balance Ook Power. In this View, I drdered a confiderable Body of Troops to be fondered a confideration Boay of Troops to be fents from hence into Flanders; and, at the Cloic of the laft Sellion, I forefaw, and point-ed out to you. That it might be incumbent upon me, to enter into further Measures for the fams great, and delirable Ends. The Aug-mentation of our Strength, in the Low Counthies, became a neeclary Step; for which Pur-pole I fent, in Concert with my Allies, Sixteen Thousand of my Electoral Troops thither, with the Hessian's in the British Pay, in order to form fuch a Force, in Conjunction with the Aultrian Troops, as might be of Service to the Common Caule, in all Events; and I doubt not, but I thall have your Affiltance in the Support of these necessary Measures.

The Magnanimity, and Firmness, of the Queen of Hungary, notwithstanding 13 many numerous Armies fent against her ; the resolute Conduct of the King of Sardinia, and his strict Adherence to his Engagements, though attacked in his own Dominions; the Stop, which has been hitherto put, to the ambitious Defigns of the Court of Spain in Italy.) #### My Lords, and Gentlemen.

The Honour, and Interest, of my Crown, and Kingdoms; the Success of the Wall, wherein I am engaged against Spain ; and the Re-establishment of the Balance and Tranquiflity of Europe, will greatly depend on the Prudence and Vigour of your Resolutions. Let it be your Care to avoid every thing that may either delay or weaken them ; and to convince the World, that you are determined to make a right Ufe of the prefent Opportunity.

The latter are supposed to be intending to gain Kelheim, Ingolftadt, and Donawerth, by passing the Danube at Thunar-dorf below Ratisbon. Prince Lobcowitz's last Publick Requisition, made by Sweden, of my will by this time have summoned Prague, from good Offices, for procuring a Peace between whence M. de Broglio is retired to take the Russia and that Crown; and the Defensive A!- Command of the Army in Bavaria. Advice, that Feldt Marshal Seckendors has an j advanced Post at Rieden, and is marching him-telf to Althain towards General Berenclau at Scherding. The latter has at the worft his Retreat fure to Paffau, and it is not doubted but the former must in a few Days be glad to gain the Leek, by lo great a Detour as that of Munich. He had already published his Patents for raifing Contributions upon Upper Austria. Count Harrach, who has been fome Time ill, now lies at the Point of Death; his Decease will make a Vacancy in the Conference.

Hubertsbourg, Nov. 18, N.S. By the laft Letters from Bavaria, it is aflured; that a bare, Continuation of the War, without giving Battle, will go near to ruin the French Army in that Country. That fince Mallepois's Retreat from Fgra, his Force, thro' Sicknefs, Death and De-fertion, actually fuffers a Diminution of 4bout .9000 Men; he detached M! Bulincourt with 3000 Men over the Dahube, near Thonauftoff, to fuccour Seckendorf, but that Detatchment is returned, and the Junction between the Imperi-alists and French was thought impracticable. Broglio arrived at their C. mp the 13th, and the same Day they marched towards the Austrians, who nevertheless think of foon going into the same Winter Quarters they had last Year. From Bohemia we hear, that General St Proon has taken Melnick, and blockaded Leuthmeritz; and that Prince Lobcowitz is endeavouling to environ Prague. If Leuthmeritz is taken, the Auftrians will have a free Paffage on the Elbe, and feut off all the Communication the French had with Egra and Saxony. The Huffars had brought?in Prisoners 200 French, who were left on the Bel raun. M. Ammond, who was his Pruffian Majefty's Refident at this Court, is recalled, and is to go to Vienna.
