The French at Teutschem furrendered themselves, on the first Summons, Prisoners of War, their Garrison confisting only of 80 Men, but upwards of 30 Officers, there being feyeral there on their Way to Prague. The Place was without Hopes of Succour, and in no State of Defence, i neither were there found in it any confiderable Quantity of Provisions. The Austrians are, in Confequence of this Acquifition, become again fole Masters of all Bohemia, excepting the Towns of Prague and Eger : In the Neighbourhood of the latter, there reigns a contagious Diftemper among the Cattle, and fuch a Mortality in the Town itfelf, that fresh Orders have been fent by this Court to Voigtland, to cut off all Communication with that Diffrict. The Sickness is faid to be general thar District. amongst all the French Troops in Germany, particularly in Marshal Broglio's Army, which,
