Florence, Dec. 1, N. S. The Pope having caused siesh Remonstrances to be made to the General Gages about evacuating the Ecclefiastical State according to his Promise; He answer'd, That the Austrians having intercepted the Courier that was bringing him the Orders of his Court touching the Winter Quarters, he was under a Necessity of waiting for the Return of the Express that he had sent to Madrid for fresh Instructions; that the Situation in which he found himself, fince the Entry into Tuscany had been barred against him, would in all Probability oblige him to feparate his Army, and that the Cavalry might take up their Winter Quarters among the Kerrarois, and the Infantry in Romania, for the Convenience of Forage and Provision. The Pope has held many Congregations of Cardinals in his Presence touching this Answer of the Spanish General: He has shewn to their Eminencies the Copies of the Letters wrote by him to the King of Spain, with the Original Answers of the aforesaid Monarch; wherein he affures the Pope that he had ordered his Troops to evacuate the Ecclefiastical State without Delay: But they are come to no Resolution, and M. de Gages will act as he pleases. His Army has been considerably diminished by frequent Desertions, and Sickness. But according to Letters from Boulogne, it always keeps up its Number, because he is continually receiving small Reinforcements, which it is believed are fecretly fent him from the Abruzzo; though it is difficult to know this certainly, because at Foligno, where his Hospitals are, and throughout all the Ecclesiastical State, he takes Care to enlift as many Men as he can
