Army to remain any longer encamped in this fevere Climate, and in this rigorous Seafon, when our Communication with the Capital is cut off. We have this Minute received Advice from the Camp, that the Army has received the Orders for commencing immediately its March towards Piemont, and it is known that this Refolution, as well as every other that has been taken in the prefent Change of our Affairs, has been previously concerted and fettled by his Sardinian Majesty with M. Villettes and Count Kaunitz, the British and Hungarian Ministers refiding here.

Vienna, Jan. 2. By our Letters from Bavaria and the Upper Palatinate, we are affured, that the Mortality is still fo great amongst the French Troops, that they bury from 2 to 300 in a Day. From Bohemia we are politively informed, that the Number of those who arrived with Marshal Bellisse at Egra, did not amount to 6000. Prince Lobkowitz has actually 2300 Prisoners taken on the Road : The whole Number loft in that March was not lefs than 4000, and 2500 remain Prifoners of War at Prague.

Vienna, Jan. 5. N.S. Dispositions are making for the March of the Army out of Bohemia into the Upper Palatinate, and the Troops under Count Khevenhuller, which were at Winterberg and Clattau, are configned by that General to Prince Lobkowitz; fo that the Queen will in a few Days have two Armies upon the Bavarian Territories. Seckendorf is still at Braunau, the Prince of Conti at Engelfelden, Broglio at Dinglefing, another Principal Officer at Landau, and the Count de Saxe at Deckendorf.

Copenhagen, Jan. 12. N. S. Yesterday by an Express the Court had News of the Deceafe of Anna Sophia Countefs of Reventlau, his late Danish Majesty's second Queen. Her Distemper was the Small Pox, of which being taken ill at the Age of Fifty, or thereabouts, the died in the Night between the 7th and 8th N. S. at a Seat called Claesholm in Jutland, where she has conftantly refided in the closeft Retirement fince the late King's Death. Drejden, Jan. 13. It is confirmed by a Let-

ter from Prague of the 5th Inftant, that near 4000 Men marched out of that Place by Virtue of the Capitulation granted to its late Garrifon, and that upwards of 2000 Sick remained as Pri-foners of War; which, added to those made at, and fince the taking of Leuthmeritz, increases the Number to 5000, besides what have been picked up out of Bohemia. Prince Lobkowitz adde, that he is preparing to extend his Poftings towards Bavaria.

Hamburgh, Jan. 15. The young Duke of Holftein was prayed for last Sunday in the publick Churches, throughout that Part of the Dutchy which remains under his Dominions, by the Title of Imperial Highnels.
