

**P**ublick Notice is hereby given, that Thomas Hinton, of Hgfton, in the County of Bucks, Dayman, was, on Monday the 28th Day of February laft, affaulted between the Hours of Nine and Ten of the Clock in the Morning, as he was travelling on Horseback on the King's Highway, in a Lane called Corn Close Lane, leading from Hogfton aforefaid, to Aylebury in the faid County, in the Liberty or Precincts of Crestlowe, within the Three Hundreds of Cottlowe in the faid County of Bucks, by one lufty Man (to the faid Thomas Hinton unknown) in a blue Great-coat and whitifh Wig, appearing to be between Thirty and Forty Years Old, riding on a large brown Geld'ng with the Tail tuck'd up at that Time, who then demanded the faid Thomas Hinton's Money, and fwore he would Shoot him if he did not deliver his Money immediately, presenting a Pistol at the fame Time to his Breast; whereupon the faid Highwayman put his Hand into the faid Thomas Hinton's Pocket, and took therout and robb'd him of Seventy Nine Pounds Nine Shillings, being all in a Bag together, Part thereof in Portugal Gold Pieces, some of Thirty-fix Shillings Value each, some of Twenty-seven Shillings Value each, and one of Eighteen Shillings Value, and the rest of the Money was in Guineas, half Guineas, and Silver, and the faid Highwayman rode away with all the faid Monies, for which the faid Thomas Hinton intends to bring his Act on against the faid Hundreds.
