IS Majesty came this Day to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes, feated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Sir Charles Dalton, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was fent with a Mellage from his Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers; the Commons being come thither accordingly, his Majefly was pleafed to give the Royal Affent to,
