From Treves of the tenth inftant they write, that the French Garrifon there, had been lately Reinforced with nine Companyes of Foot, that they are very busic about repairing their Walls, and making their Trenches higher; that the Deputies which the Magistrates of the Town had sent to his most Chriftian Majefty, to pray his Majefty would be pleafed to ease them, in certain points of the Capitulation for their late Surrender, were not as then returned.
