Shore; but the Goods imported in fuch Ship or Veflel, together with the Bedding of the Sailors, fhall be landed, opened and aired, and fo remain a Week, and after may be brought to their Places of Discharge, other than Hemp and Flax, Paper or Books, Silk Raw Thrown or Wrought, Linnen, Cotton Wooll, Cotton Yarn or manufactured, Wooll Raw, or in any wife Wrought, Feathers, Grograin or Mohair Yarn, human Hair, Goats Hair, Carmenia Wooll, Carpets, Camblets, Burdets, or other Manufactures of Silk and Cotton, Kid Skins, and Skins in the Wooll or Hair, Spunges, Wine and Oil in Chefts, Thread Stockings, all Goods pack'd with Straw or Cotton, Straw Hatts and Brushes, Matting and Artificial Flowers: Which the Officers of his Majefty's Cuftoms shall caufe to remain on Board fuch Ship or Veffel, and not permit to be landed, till an Account thereof Ihall be given unto their Excellencies in Council, and Orders shall be given concerning the fame.

That the Places for Landing and Airing the Goods imported by fuch Ships or Veffels as are or shall be liable to the Forty Days Quarantine, thall be fuch Places as fhall be appointed by his Majesty's Officers of the Customs, who are hereby impowered and required to appoint proper Places for the fame.

That whatever Ship or Perfon fhall receive any Men or Goods from on board any Ship or Veflet under Quarantine, shall be compelled to perform the like Quarantine.

That fuch Perfons as after Quarantine performed fhall be imployed in the Hold of any fuch Ship or Veffel, for the taking any Goods not liable to retain Infection from Hemp and Flax, Paper or Books, Silk Raw Thrown or Wrought, Linnen, Cotton Wooll, Cotton Yarn or Manufactured, Wooll Raw, or in any wise Wrought, Feathers, Grograin or Mohair Yarn, human Hair, Goats Hair, Carmenia Wooll, Carpets, Camblets, Burdets or other Manufactures of Silk and Cotton, Kid Skins and Skins in the Wooll or Hair, Spunges, Wine and Oil in Chefts, Thread Stockings, all Goods pack'd with Straw or Cotton, Straw Hatts and Bruthes, Matting and Artificial Flowers, thall be obliged to perform a New Quarantine of Forty Days.

That the Captains of every of his Majefty's Ships of War, who shall meet any such Ship or Veflel coming to any of the Ports of this Kingdom, shall take due Care to prevent the Landing any Goods, Seamen, or Paffengers from on Board the fame, until they shall be put under the Direction of the Officers of his Majefty's Cuftoms.

That the Commiffioners, and other Officers of his Majesty's Customs, do use their utmost Diligence and Care, that the Quarantine, before directed, be duly performed.

That the Commanders of his Majefty's Ships of War, as likewife the Commanders of his Majesty's Forts and Garrisons lying near the Sea-Coaft, be aiding and affifting to the faid Officers

Ships as aforefaid, and in bringing them to the Places appointed for the Performance of their Quarantine, and in the due Performance thereof. And the Lords Commissioners of his Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter-General and the reft of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, and his Majefty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain. Naples, July 9, N. S. The last Letters from the Government of Melfina, which are dated the 19th of last Month, bring Advice, That the Plague continues raging there in a most dreadful Manner; that the Confu on and Terrors of the People were not to be defcribed; that he Number of dead Bodies in the Streets nd the publick Places was fo much increa ed, that Eight Carts were not sufficient to carry them off; that the Government had releafed the Galley Slaves, and had appointed them to bury the Dead, but that the greatest Part of them had ficken'd thereupon, and died; that those who had escaped Death, were not able to undergo fo dangerous a Fatigue above a Day and a half, declaring they had rather be executed than continue in that Employment, and thereby greatly terrified fuch as had been able to support the lad Spectacle of fo many dead Bodies that were abandoned and mangled by the Dogs ; that there were five or fix Culares, and 40 Vicars, dead, who had attended the Sick in their last Moments, and that afterwards feveral of the regular Priefts, who had been willing to fucceed them in that Office, had shared the fame Fate; that no Religious Services could as y longer be performed, and that there were not any Servants, Chaplains or Surgeons left in the Holpitals; in fhort, that there was not either Spiritual or Temporal Comfort to be had ; that the Troops had fuffered confiderably from the Rigour of the Plague; that the Hofpital in the Lazarette had been fet apart for them, and that although the Governor had taken all poffible Care to redrefs fo many Calamities, yet, in the Confusion in which every Thing was, there daily escaped fome Perfon or other, who had been appointed to exe-' cute the Governor's Orders. In this Kingdom two Accidents have lately happened, which have occafioned great Uneafinefs. The first is, That in the exterior Calabria, in the Terra de Foffa, which joins the State of Bagnura, from the 25th of the last Month to the 2d Instant, 14 Perfons died, and upon fome of them very fuspicious Marks were found. It was supposed, that fome Perfons had stolen away privately from Messina, and landed there : As foon as this was known, the Magistrates of Health, and chiefly the Prefident of Cantunzaro, ordered very streight Barriers to be erected there, and fet a Guard of 300 of the Inhabitants over them. But upon the 28th a Man escaped, and being purfued by the Guards, ran into a Chapel, of his Majefty's Cuftoms in ftopping all fuch | in which the Day following he was found dead :
