A PROCLAMATION.

John Armagh. Robt. Jocelyn, C. • HEREAS it appears to us by feveral Examinations given in upon Oath, That Richard Simcocks, Master of the Ship called the Charming Sally of Galway, and Patrick Tierny, Part Öwner of the faid Ship, both of the Town of Galway, did, fome time in the Month of June, One thousand seven hundred and forty two, receive on board the said bhip several Felons and others ordered for Transportation, to be by them transported into fome of his Majefty's Plantations in America, but instead thereof, the fuld Richard Simcocks and Patrick Tierny carried the faid **E**elons and Convicts to certain Parts of Europe, and there exposed them to Sale, and compulied them, to the Number of Forty Perfons and upwards, to inlift as Soldiers in Foreign Service.

Now we the Lords Juftices and Council, confidering the dangerous Tendency of fuch Practices, being determined to put a Stop to Crimes of fo hemous a Nature, and to bring the Actors therein to condign Punifhment, do, by this our Proclamation publish and declare, That if any Perfon or Perfons fhall, within the Space of Six Months, apprehend the faid Richard Simcocks and Patrick Tierny, or either of them, fuch Perfon or Perfons fo apprehending them or either of them, fhall receive as a Reward, the Sum of Two Hundred Pounds Sterling, for each of the faid Perfons fo apprehended.

And we do hereby ftrictly charge and command all Juffices of the Peace, Sheriffs, and other Officers Civil and Military, and all other his Majefty's loving Subjects, that they use their utmost Endeavours to feize and apprehend the faid Offenders and every of them.

and Bar; Grand Dutchefs of Tufcarly, &c. being informed that the I lague now rages) with lo much Violence in the City of Melfina in Sicily, that there is Reason to apprehend that it may fpread into the neighbouring Parts, as well in the Kingdom of Sicily as those of Naples contiguous thereto; and being defirous to take all possible Precautions for preferving our Low Countries from this Calamity, we have!' by the Advice of those of our Privy Council, (and 'at the Inftance of our most Dear and Trusty the Count de Koniglegg Erps, Marquis of Boiffchot, our Privy Counfellor of State, Vice-Prefident of our Supreme Council of our Low Countries, Great Master of the Court of the most Serene Archdutchefs Maria Anne of Austria, and Minister Plenipotentiary for the Government of all our faid Low Countries, &c. in the Abfence of our most dear and right well-beloved Brotherin Law the most Serene Prince Charles of Lorraine and Bar, our Lieutenant-Governor and Captain-General of our aforefaid Low Countries) prohibited and forbidden, and do by these Prefents prohibit and forbid the Entry of all Veslels and Ships, without Distinction, of what Nation joever they may be, and even of our own Subjects, as well of these Low Countries, as of others within our Dominions, laden or not laden, coming from the Ports of the Kingdoms of Sicily and Naples, into the Ports and Harbours of our Dominions.

And to prevent all Multakes, we do command the Mafters of Sloops, pofted at the Entrances of our faid Ports and Harbours, that, as foon as any Veffel, Ship, on other Imbarkation, fhall come in Sight, they go out to meet the fame, keeping to Windward if it be poffible, and demand from whence the Veffel is, and from whence it cometh; and in cafe that it eometh from the Ports of the Kingdoms of Sicily or Naples, they ihall give Notice to the Captain or Mafter of the faid Veffel by a fpeaking Trumpet, keeping at as great a Diftande' as poffible from the faid Veffel or her Boat, to bear off infmediately, and acquaint him, that in Cafe he approaches, he fhall be funk; and at the fame Time the faid Mafters of the Sloops thall hang out a Red Flag, to ferve as a Signal to the Governors and Commanders of our faid Ports, that the faid Ship or Veffel cometh from one of the faid Ports of the two Siciles.

- And as to the Veffels, of what Nation foever they may be, even of our Subjects, coming from Ports in the Mediterranean or the Adriatick Sea, without Diffinction, under whatever Dominion the faid Ports may be they thalk be obliged to perform a Quarantine has Forty Days, in the Places which shalk be tappointed, them for that Purpole
