Turin, August 17, N. S.

THERE was, two Days ago, a small Skirmish between an advanced Guard of our Vaudois on Mount Senis, and a Detachment of two and thirty Companies of Spanish Grenadiers, six hundred Miquelets, and two Troops of Dragoons, at the Head of which M. de Castellar was come to reconnoitre that Passage: But though the Vaudois at first lost Ground, yet on their being reinforced, they recovered the Post, and have kept it: We lost three or four Men on our Side, and the Spaniards some few more, as we have since been informed by several of their Deserters, who came in Yesterday.

Worms, September 4, N. S. Baron Sohlen-thal the Danish Minister is arrived at Frankfort, and is expected here every Day. We hear that this Morning the respective Quarter-masters General of the Combined Army set out to reconnoitre the Ground near Frankenthal. Count Nassau was last Sunday at Marburg, one Hundred English Miles from hence, with the Dutch Troops under his Command.
