HERE was, two Days ago, a small Skirmish between an advanced Guard of our Vaudois on Mount Senis, and a Detachment of two and thirty Companies of Spanish Grenadiers, fix hundred Miquelets, and two Troops of Dragoons, at the Head of which M. de Castellar was come to reconnoitre that Passage: But though the Vaudois at first lost Ground, yet on their being reinforced, they recovered the Post, and have kept it; We lost three or four Men on our Side, and the Spaniards fome few more, as we have fince been informed by feveral of their Deferters, who came in Yesterday.

We hear that this Morning the respect e Quarter-masters General of the Combined Army fet out to reconnoitre the Ground near Frankenthal.
