P R E S E N T,

Their Excellencies the Lords Justices in Council.

Whereas Information has been this Day given to their Excellencies the Lords Justices at this Board, that upon the 4th of this Instant a Dutch Ship attempted to come into Plymouth Sound, and that there is great Reason to believe she came from Messina, and has the Plague on Board, and that upon being ordered off the Coast, the Master refused to comply therewith till two Shot had been fired at him; after which he bore away, and steered to the South East: For preventing therefore the said Ship from coming into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, It is ordered by their Excellencies the Lords Justices in Council, that the Commissioners of his Majesty's Customs do immediately give Notice to all the Officers at the several Ports, to take the utmost Care to prevent the said Ship from coming into, or being admitted into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or into any of the Places appointed for Performance of Quarantine. The said Ship is Fly-boat built, of about Four hundred Tons, high Stern'd, hath a small Lyon Head, and very foul, and there is carved in her Stern below the Windows in yellow Letters, *De Resolute*. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of his Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

*Petersbourg, August 13.* Last Thursday Night a Courier, dispatched from the Congress at Abo, arrived here with the definitive Treaty of Peace between Russia and Sweden, lately concluded and signed there by the respective Plenipotentiaries of the two Courts.

*Vienna, Sept. 4, N. S.* On Monday last Feldt Marshal Prince Lobkowitz set out upon his Journey for Italy, in order to take upon him the Command of her Majesty's Army there.

*Hamburg, September 10.* The Bishop of Lubeck holds himself in Readiness for his Departure for Stockholm. Admiral Taube, with four Men of War, lies before Stralsund, waiting for his Royal Highness. The Frederick-Amelia, and a Yacht, are both fitted up in a Manner to receive him, that he may choose on which he will embark. The Senators from Sweden, who are to conduct that Prince thither, are arrived here this Evening.

*Hague, Sept. 13, N. S.* By Letters from Prince Charles's Army, of the 5th Instant, N. S. we have Advice, that an Attempt which was made the Day before to pass the Rhine, had

proved unsuccessful, Five Companies of Grenadiers, under the Command of the Prince of Waldeck, who had actually taken Post on the French Side, having been repulsed by M. Balincourt, and the greater Part of them killed, drowned, or taken Prisoners. These Letters add, that the French had on their Part lost near 700 Men in the Action, and that another Attack was carrying on by the Austrian Forces in the Neighbourhood of Brisac. We hear that the Capitulation of Ingolstadt was signed the 1st Instant; by which a considerable Time is allowed to the Garrison of that Place to expect Relief from the Emperor or France, before they are actually to surrender the Town to M. Bernclau.

*Admiralty-Office, Sept. 8.*

His Majesty's Ship the *Monmouth*, commanded by Capt. Windham, arrived in the Downs from a Cruize on the 6th Instant; and brought in a Spanish Ship, commissioned by the King of Spain, of 300 Tons, 14 Guns, and 110 Men, 25 of which are Soldiers. She was taken the 8th of last Month, about 20 Leagues from the Isle of Teneriff, in her Passage from Cadiz to La Vera Cruz. Her Cargoe consists of 800 Bales of dry Goods, 66 Tons of Quicksilver, 50 Tons of Iron, some Wax, Saffron, Oyl, and Wine; which cost the Spaniards about 100,000 l. exclusive of the Quicksilver.

Capt. Windham has also brought in a Spanish Privateer of 18 Guns and 125 Men, which he took in his Cruize, in Company with the *Medway* commanded by Capt. Cockburne. She is called the *St. Michael* of Bilboa, and was commanded by Capt. Laurence Bermer.

Capt. Windham met with a Portuguese Ship from China, which left Capt. Anson Careening his Ship at Mocoa on the 5th of February, N. S.
