Rome, September 7.

**O**N the 2d Instant an Estafette arrived here from the Governor of Civita Vecchia, with Notice of the Arrival at that Port, on the 1st Instant, of three English Ships of War, and that the Commander had demanded to be immediately admitted to Prattick. Cardinal Acquaviva has demanded of the Pope the Passage for a Party of Gunners (as belonging to the King of Spain) from Orbitello to the Army commanded by the Duke of Modena, on Condition to perform such Quarantine as shall be prescribed to them.

Naples, September 10. Many Vessels are arrived lately at this Port from Apuglia, with Provisions for this Capital, the Government being seriously attentive to provide the Fortresses of this Kingdom with all Sort of Necessaries. The Accounts of this Week from Messina and Reggio are not favourable: The Sicknes has again begun to rage severely in those Parts. Many neighbouring Villages are afflicted with it, and it is even extended among the Soldiers and Guards of the first Line. The Dead of the Plague at Reggio are reckoned about 500, and the Number of Sick is much greater.

Florence, Sept. 17. On the 12th Instant a Courier arrived here from Rome, with Notice of a Promotion of twenty seven Cardinals in a Consistory held on the 9th Instant. From Lombardy we are informed, that on the 10th Prince Lobkowitz and his Son arrived there from Germany, and that on the 15th he was to take upon him, with the usual Formality, the Government of the State of Milan, and the Command of the Austrian Armies, resigned by Marshal Trauti. We do not learn any other News from that Quarter, the Armies continuing in their usual Situations.
