

Copenhagen, Oct. 8, N. S. The Transports with the Artillery from Holstein are all safely arrived here, though they were separated and dispersed in a Storm: They have landed the Field Pieces, but the heavy Cannon is still kept on board. The Russian Frigate stranded lately upon the Isle of Anholt, is utterly lost, but the Men are saved. Four or five Men of War belonging to the dispersed Squadron of Archangel, which consisted of nine Sail, have dropt in here, and lie now at Anchor before this Place, where they are treated in a very friendly Manner.

Hambourg, Oct. 9, N. S. There is, as yet, no Advice arrived of the Bishop of Lubeck's having landed in Sweden: His Royal Highness sailed from Wittauport, in the Island of Rugen, the 1st Instant, but by contrary Winds was driven back, and did not put to Sea again till the 5th, since when the Wind having been favourable, the News is expected every Hour of his Highness's having landed at Udftet.

And in Case any of the said Officers shall not be able to attend themselves to receive their Money, but employ Attorneys for that Purpose, that the said Attorneys may produce the like Certificates and Affidavits from the Persons they are employed by.
