The Tranfports with the Artillery from Holftein are all fafely arrived here, though they were feparated and difperfed in a Storm : They have landed the Field Pieces, but the heavy Cannon is still kept on board. The Russian Frigate stranded lately upon the Isle of Anholt, is utterly lost, but the Men are faved. Four or five Mcn of War belonging to the difperfed Squadron of Archangel, which confifted of nine Sail, have dropt in here, and lie now at Anchor before this Place, where

they are treated in a very friendly Manner. Hambourg, Oct. 9, N. S. There is, as yet, no Advice arrived of the Bithop of Lubeck's having landed in Sweden : His Royal Highness failed from Wittauport, in the Island of Rugen, the 1ft Instant, but by contrary Winds was dri-ven back, and did not put to Sea again till the 5th, fince when the Wind having been favour-able, the News is expected every Hour of his Highness's having landed at Uditet.
