Hereas this present Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the Thirteenth Day of this Instant October, We with the Advice of his Majesty's Privy Council, do hereby publish and de-clare, that the said Parliament shall be surther prorogued on the said Thirteenth Day of Octo-ber, to Tuelday the Twenty Second Day of November next; and we have given Order that a Commission be prepared for proroguing the fame accordingly. And we do hereby further declare his Majesty's Pleasure, that the said Parliament shall on the said Tuesday the Twenty Second Day of November next, be held and sit for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs. And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens and Burgesles, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their Attendance accordingly at Westminster on the said Tuesday the Twenty Second Day of November next.

GOD Save the KING.

Warms, Odd 13, N.S. On Thursday last his Majesty gave Orders for the combined Army's returning to Worms, and accordingly on Friday Morning, at break of Day, it was in full March, and arrived about Ten at Mutterstadt, where his Majesty lay that Night: Yesterday it marched to Frankenthal, and this Forenoon encamped in the Neighbourhood, of this Place, where his Majesty arrived about Ten. To-morrow it halts, and on Thursday will march towards Oppenheim.
