Gonstantinople, April 23.

HE Dutch Ambassador departed the 15th for Holland, by Way of Vienna. The Reis Essendi was changed about ten Days ago, and made Bashaw of Cairo. Mustapha Bashaw, who was Reis Essendi before, is again restored to that Ostice. Here is great Silence as to News from Persia. Some People surmise, by the Governor of Bagdat's Kayhaw continuing here, that a Negotiation is still on Foot. In a very sew Days the small Fleet will sail for the Black Sea. 'Tis assured that the Captain Bashaw is to rebuild the Fort of Ockzakow.

Stockholm, May 22. On Thursday last, the King and Prince Royal of Sweden, returned to Carlsberg, from Droningholm, and the Day before Yesterday, his Majesty, and his Royal Highness came to Town.

Genoa, May 23. Letters from Rome of the 16th Instant advise, that Prince Lobcowitz's Army was in March to enter into the Kingdom of Naples, for which Purpose Bridges have been laid over the River Tyber at Monte Rotondo; that a Detachment of about 2000 Spaniards had returned into the Roman State at Ascoli, with a Defign to have surprized some of the Austrian Magazines, but were luckily prevented by a Party of Hussars, who came up in time to the Assistance of the small Body that were left to guard them. On the 21st Instant arrived his Britannick Majesty's Bomb Vesses, the Terrible, Carcass, and Fire Drake, with their Tenders. Admiral Mathews, with the Fleet under his Command, is now under Sail coming out of Vado Bay, and steering to the Westward.

Hague, June 12. According to our best and sreshest Advices, Prince Charles camped on the 6th Instant at Wisloch near Heidelberg, and was preparing to pass the Neckar the second Time at Ladenburg. Some Blows have been exchanged between his Highness's Hussar and those of Count Seckendors, and each Side represents the other as having been the Aggressors, and itself as having had the Advantage.
