which they took from us, without taking any Step from which we can judge, whether they intend to advance towards Saluze, or throw themfelves into the Valley of Stura, in order to join the Body of their Troops, which has already appeared in the Neighbourhood of Demont. It is thought that the Reafon of their thus fufpending their Operations, is, their ex-pecting the coming up of their Artillery and Cavalry. The King has affembled feveral Corps, which were at a Diftance, and is taking all the most proper Measures to prevent the Enemy's reaping any farther Benefit from the fmall Advantage they have had over us. His Majefty has already with him 24 Battalions, and continues posted between St. Pierre and La Tourette, which is within two Miles of Chateau Dauphin. All the Cavalry and Guards are ordered to incamp near Saluze. The Marquis Palavicini is to take Post with eleven Battations, and fome Bodies of Horfe which he commands, at the Bridge of Ulla upon the Stura, which is half Way between Demont and Coni, to be in the Way to harafs the Enemy, if they undertake the Siege of Demont. However it is not yet known, with any Certainty, whether they will begin by the Siege of that Place, or of Coni. An exact Account having been taken, it is found, that our Lofs in the Attacks of the 17th, 18th and 19th Instant, did not exceed 600 Men. That of the Enemy cannot be lefs than 3000.
