## St. James's, October 30.

HIS being the Anniversary of the King's Birth Day, his Majesty received at Noon the Compliments of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Rersons of Distinction. On this Occasion the Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired, and in the Evening there were Bonsires, Illuminations, and other publick Demonstrations of Joy, throughout London and Westminister.

Translation of a Letter from her Majesty the Queen of Hungary and Bohemia to the Laudable Convention of the Circle of Satabia, assembled at Ulm. Dated Vienna, October 16, 1744.

Maria Therefia, &c. &c.

**B**Efore we received your Anfwer of the 3d of this Inftant, upon Information from our Minifter Plenipotentiary Baron Ramfchway, that it had once been propofed to put neutral Troops of the Circle into our City and Fortrefs of Conftance, as well as into other fortified Towns and Paffes fituate in our Anterior Auftrian Dominions, we had agreed to that Propofal, and inftructed our faid Minifter in every Thing that feem'd neceffary for the fpeedy Execution of the fame.

We had likewife ordered, before the Receipt of the above-mentioned Anfwer, that, not only nothing fhould be attempted againft the Electoral Bavarian Dominions incorporated into the Circle of Swabia, but that even those Things fhould be reftored, which, after the unjust Aggreffion of our Enemy, had been fairly feized by way of Reprizal. The Value of the Enemy's Effects was repaid last Year, and the Provisions taken from him reftored to the Bavarian Commiffary acting in those Parts.

And lastly, we had fent Instructions, before receiving the Answer so often mention'd, to our Administrators in Bavaria, to make a reasonable Agreement with M. Von Oettinger, the Duke of Wurtemberg's Minister, who was sent to Munich for that Purpole, concerning the full

Reftoration of the Rations, and other Contributtons raifed last Year: And we are in Hopes that this difficult Affair has already been determin'd to the Satisfaction of both Parties.

By this you fee, that, as much as is confiftent with the Indemnification due to the Rights of our Archducal Houfe, not only folemnly acknowledg'd, but even guarantied in the ampleft Manner by the whole Empire, we constantly endeavour with the utmost Attention, to anticipate the Delires of all true Patriot States of the faid Empire.

Our Conduct is the fame upon all Occafions, entirely confiftent with the Laws of Nature and Nations, as well as with the falutary Laws of the Empire, but has more effectively for its Object, the inward Tranquility and Confitution of our dear Native Country, the Liberty of Europe, and the Safety of all Chriftendom.

We have fhewr ourfelves as peaceable and reconcileable in the midft of the greateft Succefs of our juft Arms, as we did at the Time that our faithlefs and obfinate Enemies had already totally opprefied our Archducal Houfe, and in purfuance thereof, allumed to themfelves a Superiority over the Empire, and even over all Europe.

We have used the fame Attention and Precaution, lince the beginning of the just Defence, to which we have been forc'd, that the Theatre of War might be removed from the Neutral Dominions of the Empire. How far we proceeded therein, even to the Neglect of a Precaution, which having fince appear'd but too neceffary, on account of our Adversary's Way of thinking, is very well known.

Our Enemy's Troops have magnanimoufly been fpared, when they might eafily have been deftroy'd. The bad Ufe which was intended to be made of them, and which has manifefted itfelf but too much, was no Secret to us. Neverthele's we ufed no other Means but Remonftrances for fecuring ourfelves againft it, avoiding even any feeming Occafion of Blame. And you know beft, how on this very account we addrefied ourfelves to the Laudable Circle of Swabia', partly by our late Letter of the 11th of February,
