Upon the 24th the Troops fixed their Camp here. The same Day the Duke of Weissenselds received Advice, that the whole Prussian Army made a Shew as if they intended to attack the Left Wing of the Combined Army, which was compo-fed of Saxon Froops: Thereupon his Serene Highness having demanded a Reinforcement of Prince Charles, who fent him immediately 35 Squadrons, under the Command of Lieutenant Feldt Marshal Bernes, and fix Battalions of Hungarian Infantry, under the Command of Feldt Marshal Lieutenant Prince Piccolomini, as also the Corps of Hussars under General Nadasti, the Saxons drew up in Order of Battle, and remained the greatest, Part of the Night of the 25th under Arms, in Expectation of being attacked by the Prussians, the Day after; but the Pruffians having feen the good Dispositions which had been made to receive them, made a Motion to the Left, and retired to their old Camp.
