N the 8th Instant arrived here his Britannick Majesty's Ships the St. Albans and Falmouth from Porto Bello, and brought in with them a French Sloop called the Maria Louisa, of eight Carriage Guns, and 14 Swivel, and Fifty Men, taken at the Grand Baru; and a Ship called the Tamer-lane, of Twenty-two Carriage and Twentyfour Swivel Guns, and 130 Men, taken near the River Sinu, both of them computed at 46,875 l. Capt. Knight of the St. Albans, and Capt. Coleby of the Falmouth, had been fent by Vice Admiral Ogle to demand of the Governor of Porto Bello the Restitution of the Sloop Triton, James Christie, Master, and her Cargo, which were taken by a Spanish Peragua from Porto Bello, at Garote, the 7th of January last, although the Master had Leave to trade from the Vice-Roy of Santa Fee. The said Captains, after having been detained there feveral Days in daily Expectation of receiving Satisfaction for the faid Sloop Triton, by the trifling and evalive Behaviour of the Governor, began to fire upon the Town, which they did incessantly for several Hours, and beat down many Houses, amongst which was that of the Governor; and did great Damage in general to the Place.
