Vienna, Jan. 9, N. S. The Pruffians have abardoned Opelen; but are still Masters of Kofel, where the regular Fortifications, intended by the King of Pruffia, are not perfected; but are in such a Forwardness as to demand the Employing of Cannon to diflodge the Garrison.

Vienna, Jan. 11, N.S. The King of Poland is expected as next Sunday at Olmutz, for which Place Count Buneau his Minister intends to set out on Thursday next, and the Great Duke on Saturday, attended by Count Kinski, as Chancellor of Bohemia. Every Thing is prepared for making his Polish Majesty's Pallage as safe, expeditious, and commodious as is possible.

Vienna, Jan. 11, N.S. Prince Charles is ftill here. General Thungen is recalled from the Army in the Palatinate, to take the Command of the Postirung or Cantonment of the Austrian Troops in Silesia, which extends itself through Glatz to the Oder. The old Prince of Anhalt Deffau is faid to be affembling Troops at Streelen and Henrichaw; and it is industrioully given out at Breflau, that upon the Conclusion of a Treaty between Prussia and Russia, which is pretended to be hourly expected, Bohemia and Moravia are to be invaded anew. General Berenclau has cleared the Upper Palatinate as high as Stadtamhoff and Ratisbonne, and General Thungen's Corps, (which will be commanded by General Tawn) is advancing, fo that the French and Bavarians will have the latter in Front, and the former in their-Rear.]

vices from Silefia, the Auftrians bave found great Numbers of Recruits there, and the King of Pruffia has demanded 30,000 Horfes to remount his Cavalry. Prince Lobkowitz is to be recalled from Italy: The Army there in the Spring will be compleated to 32,000.

Vienna; Jan. 16, N. S. An Adjutant General is arrived here with Advice of the Defeat of 700 French Foot, who with 200 Bavarian Horse were in March to throw themselves into Amberg. The Bavarians fled immediately upon the Approach of the Austrians, and the Foot belonging to Marshal de Saxe's Regiment were all killed or taken Prisoners. General Thungen proposed to attack Amberg the next Day, or to advance against a Body of 15000 Men which are faid to be in March from Kelheim; as no News is arrived fince, it is supposed that he is gone to meet, or is waiting for the Enemy. It is now confirmed that the old Prince of Dellau has passed the Neiss with 42 Battalions and 18 Squadrons, whereupon Marshal Traun is allembling his whole Force at Jagendorff, but which is by no Means equal to that of the Pruffiane. The worst however that is feared is the Loss of the Flat Country, and of such advanced Posts as Paschgau, Ziegenhals and Neustadtsle. Count Buneau set out on Thursday last, and the Great Duke with his numerous Court fet out this Morning for Olmutz, where the King of Poland will arrive To-morrow in the Evening. The Bishop of Olmutz is chosen Archbishop of Saltzburg. Vienna, Jav. 20, N.S. The Prussians who are advancing in Upper Silefia, and who are faid to be composed of 42 Battalions and 18 Squadrons, are not supposed to make a Body of above 24,000 Men. They have no Baggage not great Artillery, and having brought with them 500 empty Waggons, which are, it is thought, defigned to fetch Wood in particular, amongst other
