Stockholm, February 5, O. S.

HIS Swedish Majesty and the Prince Successor set out this Morning for Grönisholm, about seven Swedish Miles off, where they propose to spend the Remainder of this Week in hunting the Elk.

Dresden, Feb. 21, N. S. Upon the 12th or 13th of this Month, a Body of 1200 Prussians, with 20 Pieces of Cannon, advanced as far as Plomnitz, near Habelschwerd in the County of Glatz. Lieutenant General Wallis, who was posted there with a small Body of Austrians, after having for some Time made Head against the Enemy, was obliged to retire from thence to Mittelwald, and from Mittelwald between Grulich and Gramberg, with the Loss of about 300 Men killed and wounded; and the Prussians lost near the same Number.

Hambourg, March 5. The Princess Royal of Sweden has miscarried, in the 5th Month of her Pregnancy, of a Male Child, and was at first thought to be in Danger of her Life. But by our last Advices from Stockholm of the 23d of last Month, her Royal Highness had then pass'd two tolerable Days. The same Mortality amongst the Cattle which still continues in Holstein, has now manifested itself in the County of Oldemburgh.

Hambourg, Feb. 23, N. S. Last Night the Dutchess of Holstein celebrated the Anniversary of the Great Duke's Birth-day. Two Dutch Officers belonging to the Regiments of Prince Stolberg and M. Oyen, which are raising for the Service of the Republick, are recruiting here, and meet with some Success.

Hambourg, Feb. 26, N. S. Advices from Silesia confirm the Progress of a contagious Distemper amongst the Prussian Army. The Empress of Russia returned to Petersbourg the 7th Instant, N. S. with her Nephew the Great Duke, who is perfectly recovered of his late Distemper, the Small Pox. The last Letters from Francfort, mention, that the French decamped from that Neighbourhood the 18th, in order to repass the Maine. The Magistrates here have published a Placard, containing certain Observances, under severe Penalties both corporal and mulctuary, to prevent the Danger which is apprehended from the Mortality which has manifested itself among the horned Cattle in the Baillage of Tundern of the Dutchy of Sleswick, and which has since communicated itself to some

Parts of the Dutchy of Holstein; at the same Time was published a Remedy for the said Evil, sent from Middelburgh in Zeland, with an authentick Affidavit, that more than a Thousand Head of Cattle had been preserved by it.

Vienna, Feb. 21, N. S. We have several Accounts from Silesia of an Epidemical Sicknes which rages in the Prussian Army. They have shut up Neifs themselves to prevent the Communication, and great Numbers are sick at Munsterberg. The Saxons have formed a Line, to prevent, if possible, the spreading of the Infection, and it is thought that our Troops must quickly do the like. There has lately been a Skirmish in the County of Glatz, between a large Body of Prussians and a few of ours, in which between 2 and 300 on each Side were killed, and the Austrians obliged to retire a Post or two.

Vienna, Feb. 24, N. S. There is Advice, that the Bavarians from the Saltza, and the Palatins and Hessians, are assembling, and that in Proportion as they advance towards the Austrians, the French advance in taking Possession of the Posts and Quarters left by the Hessians. General Bathiani will, it is thought, command in Italy, General Brown in Bavaria, and General Hagenbach in Tuscany; which last Country seems to be in imminent Danger, by the double Entry intended by the Spaniards from Fuligno and Viterbo.

Berlin, Feb. 23, N. S. The Day before Yesterday Te-Deum was sung here, under a Discharge of Cannon, for the Victory lately obtained over the Austrians in the County of Glatz. Horses are continually passing through this Place into Silesia to reimburse the Cavalry there. It is said, that the Prussian Army by the Spring will be 50,000 strong. General Einsidel, the late Prussian Commandant at Prague, has been acquitted by the Council of War, and their Sentence is now before the King of Prussia for his Approbation.

Berlin, Feb. 27, N. S. His Prussian Majesty gave Baron Erthal, the Elector of Metz's Minister, his first Audience upon the 24th past, and the Day before Yesterday he was presented with the King's Picture set in Diamonds, valued at 4000 Crowns. Upon the 24th the French Minister M. Valori returned from Dresden. His Majesty's Departure for Silesia is deferred till the 4th of March.
