Madeira, December 14, O. S.

VICE Admiral Davers arrived here upon the 7th, having met with a great deal of bad Weather in his Passage. The first Night after he sailed, he lost Company with most of the Fleet, but within three Days after his Arrival here, Capt. Legge in the *Strafford*, with the *Enterprize* and *Merlin*, and about 20 Sail of Merchant Ships, joined him, and To-morrow he proposes to sail for *Barbadoes*.

Stockholm, Feb. 12, O. S. On Thursday last about Noon, the Princess Royal was taken extremely ill, and continued so till next Morning, when she had the Misfortune to miscarry. An Express being immediately sent with an Account of this Accident to the King and Prince Successor, who were at *Grimsholm*, taking the Pleasure of hunting, his Royal Highness came to Town the same Morning, and the King in the Afternoon. The Princess had a little Fever on her the two first Days after her Miscarriage, but having since been let Blood, she is, at present, in a pretty good State of Health again. One Day last Week died upon his Estate in *Ostergothland*, Lieutenant General Count Spence, a Gentleman descended of an English Family. He had a Regiment of Horse called *Le Regiment du Corps*, the Command of which, will now, as it is said, be conferr'd on Colonel *Ungern*, the Marshal of the last Diet. We have now seven Posts due from *Petersbourg*, so that we have no Account as yet if the Empress be returned thither, or of any Business that may be transacting there; but by Letters from *Poland* and other Parts, we are informed, that there are great Motions amongst the Troops in *Livonia* and on the Frontiers of *Prussia*.

Oporto, Feb. 21. By Advices from *Cadiz* of the 17th of January, seven French Men of War were then in that Bay, preparing to sail in a few Days for the Island of *Martinico*, and three Spanish Men of War were to accompany them, and a great Number of Marines were put on board, which, it was supposed, were designed for the Ships at the *Havanna*, to enable them to come to Europe.

Copenhægen, March 2. Last Night the French Minister gave a publick Entertainment, consisting of a Supper and a Ball, upon Occasion of the Dauphin's Marriage. The Duke and Dutches of *Wirtemberg*, the Ladies, and Chief Officers of the several Courts, with other Persons of Distinction to the Number of about 128, assisted at it.

Faro, March 2. Five French Men of War are lately returned to the Bay of *Cadiz*. A French Merchantman, in Register from *Vera Cruz*, is also arrived in the said Bay with a Cargo of very considerable Value.

Vienna, March 4, N. S. The Sickness amongst the Prussian Troops in *Silesia* continues. We have Accounts, that there are no less than four Places shut up by themselves, in order to prevent the Spreading of the Infection. In twelve Hours the Distemper is begun and ended, and is generally mortal. Our Army in Upper *Silesia* has received 5000 Recruits from *Bohemia*, and several are daily sent into *Italy* to augment the Army there. The Hungarian Insurgents in the Dutchy of *Oppelen* are continually skirmishing with the Prussians, but without any great Losses on either Side.

Vienna, March 6. General *Brown* is gone to *Bavaria*, to take the Command of the Troops there, but it will be hardly possible for him to enter upon Action, unless forced to it, in less than three or four Weeks.

Berlin, March 9, N. S. It is given out here, that the Prussian Army in *Silesia* is already compleated, and that it will act the next Campaign in four different Corps under the Command of the King of *Prussia*, the reigning Prince of *Dessau*, Prince *Leopold*, and Veld Marshal *Schwerin*. The King's Kitchen sets out for *Silesia* upon the 11th, and his Majesty will follow upon the 15th.

Dresden, March 10, N. S. On Friday last his Polish Majesty and the Electoral Prince received the Compliments of a numerous Court, on Occasion of its being their Names-Day. After which his Majesty dined in the Prince's Apartment with the Foreign Ministers and several other Persons of the first Quality. At each Health a Salvo was given of the Cannon on the Ramparts.
