Westminster, May 2. -IS Majesty came this Day to the House of Peers, and being in his Rotal Robes (ented on the Throne Straits, to the Western and May Straits, to the Western and Southern Control Straits, to the Western and

Royal Robes, feated on the Throne with the ufual Solemnity, Sir Charles Dalton, Gentleman-Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from his Majesty to the Houfe of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majefty was pleased to give the Royal Atlent to,

An Act for granting to His Majesty the Sum of 800,000 l. out of the Sinking Fund; and far granting a Sum remaining in the Exchequer (arifen by the Surplus of the Duties upon Malt, Mum, Eyder and Perry) for the Service of the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Forty Five, and for the further appropriating the Supplies granted in stansalian of Parlian , unu for the giving jurther Line for the Payment of Duties, omitted to be paid for the Indentures or Contracts of Clerks and Apprentices; and for the further enforcing the Payment of the faid Duties.

An AET for repealing the present Inland Duty of Four Shillings per Pound Weight upon all Tea fold in Great Britain, and for granting to His Majesty certain other Inland Duties in lieu thereof; and for better securing the Duty upon Tea, and other Duties of Excise; and for pursuing Offenders out of one County into another. An Act for allowing certain additional Bounties on the Exportation of British and Irish Li-*Mons*. An Act for effectually preventing the Exporta-tion of foreign Linens, under the Denomination of Britiff or Iriff Linens. An Act for prohibiting the Wearing and Importation of Cambricks and French Lawns. An Act to explain and amend the Laws touching the Elections of Knights of the Shire to serve in Parlioment, for that Part of Great Britain called England. An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act passed in the 5th Year of bis present Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Act for the further Qualifi-Sation of Justices of the Peace.

An Act to indemnify Persons who have been guilty of the unlawful importing, landing, or running of probibited, uncustomed, or other Goods or Merthandize.

An Act for more effectually preventing the stealing of Linen, Fustian, and Cotton Goods and Wares, in Buildings, Fields, Grounds, and other Places, used for printing, whitening, bleaching, or drying the fame. An Act for impowering the surviving Commissioners and Trustees for forfeited Estates, to execute proper Conveyances of the late Lord Widdrington's Estate in the County of Northum berland (tontracted for by the York Buildings Company) to Trustees for the Creditors of the faid Company, upon Payment of a Sum of Money, therein mentioned, into His Majesty's Exshequer. An Act for making the Surgeons of London and the Barbers of London, two separate and distinct Corporations. An Act for granting further Powers to the Commissioners for building-a Bridge cross she River Thames, from the City of Westminster, to the opposite Shore in the County of Surrey; and for she
